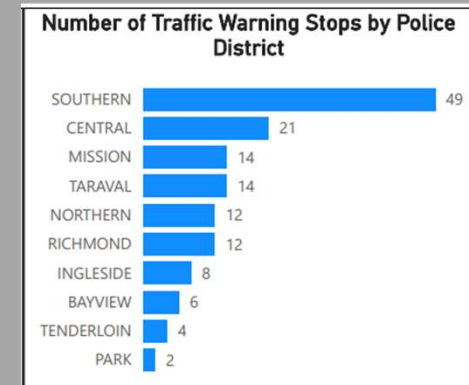

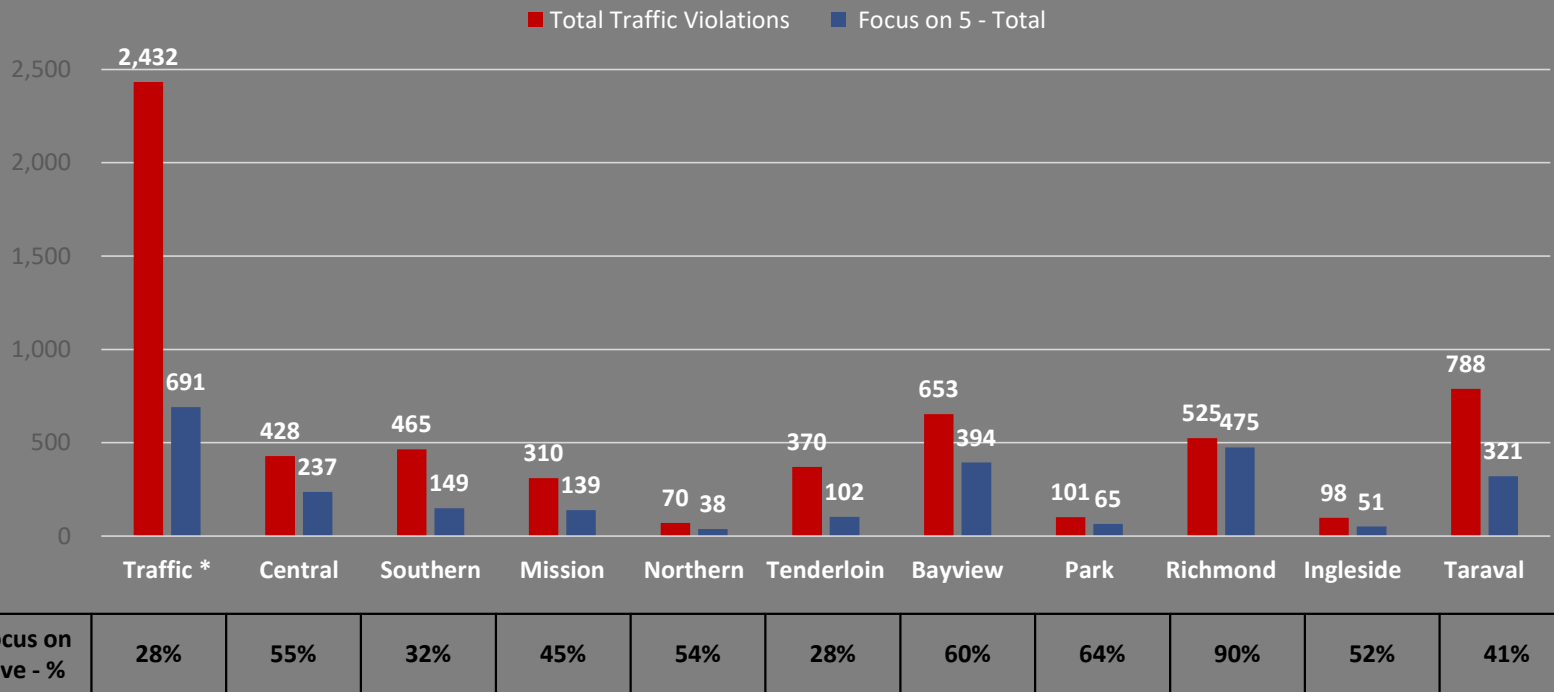
Department Wide Traffic Warning Stop Issuance 1/1/2026 – 3/31/2026

Department Wide Traffic Violations & Focus on the Five Violations 1/1/2026 – 3/31/2026

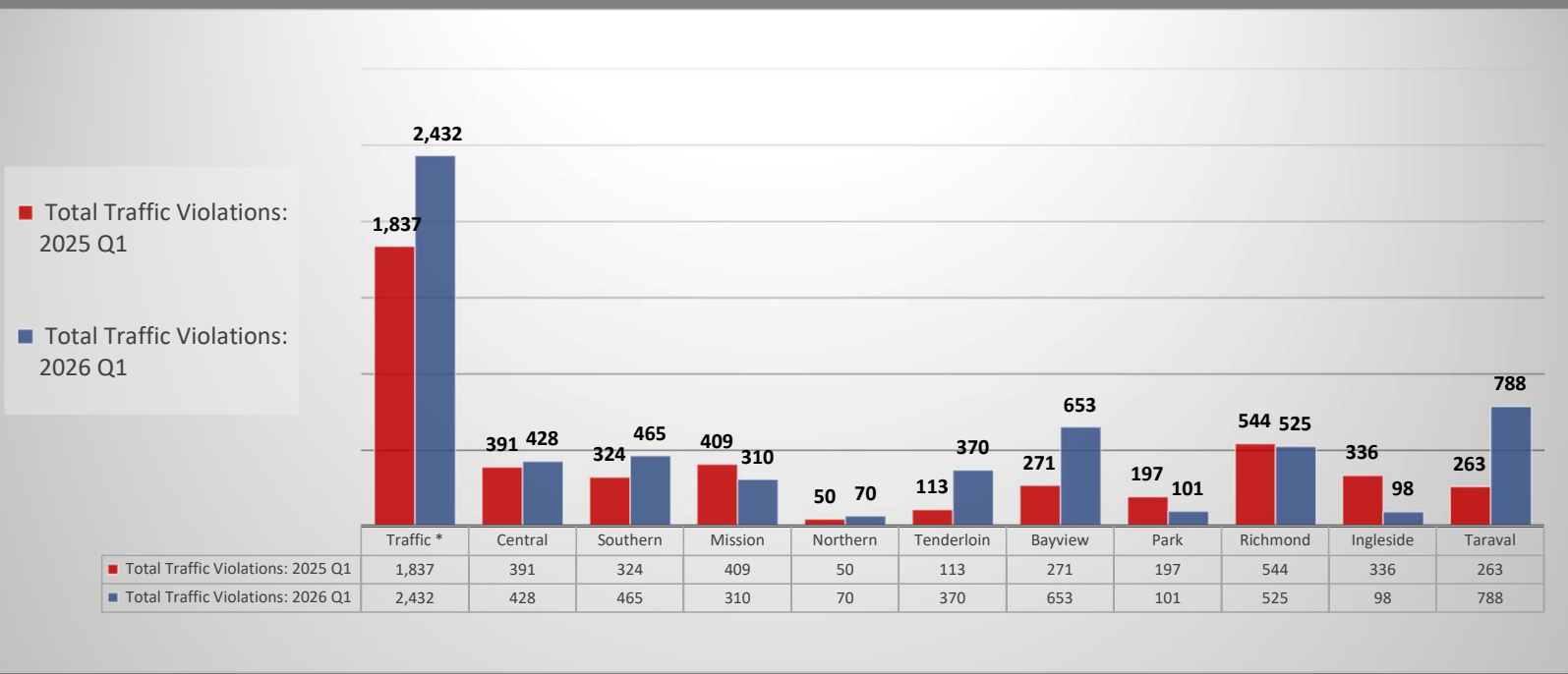

Department Wide Total Traffic Violations Issuance 2025 Q1 vs 2026 Q1



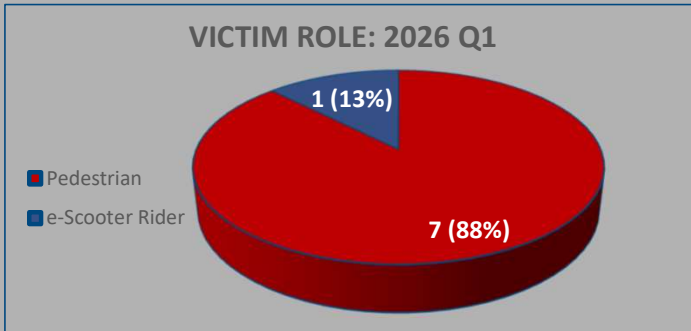

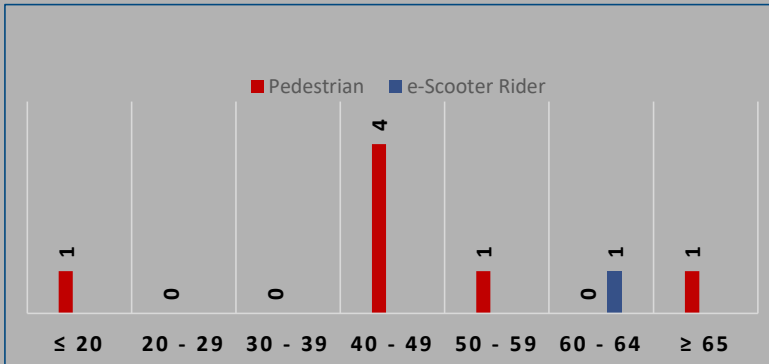
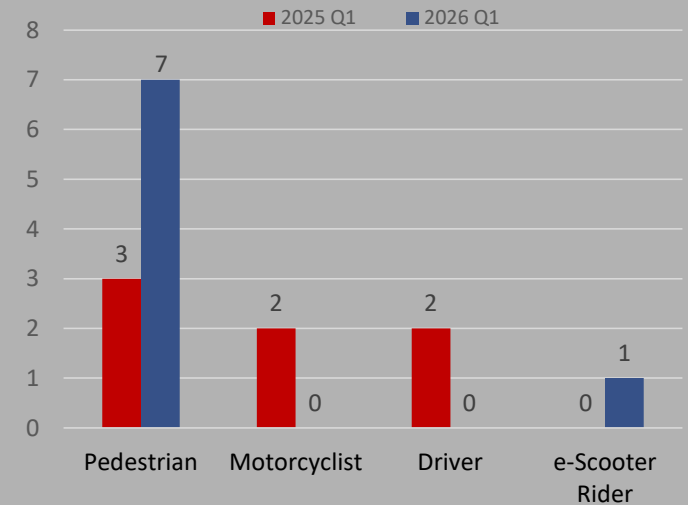

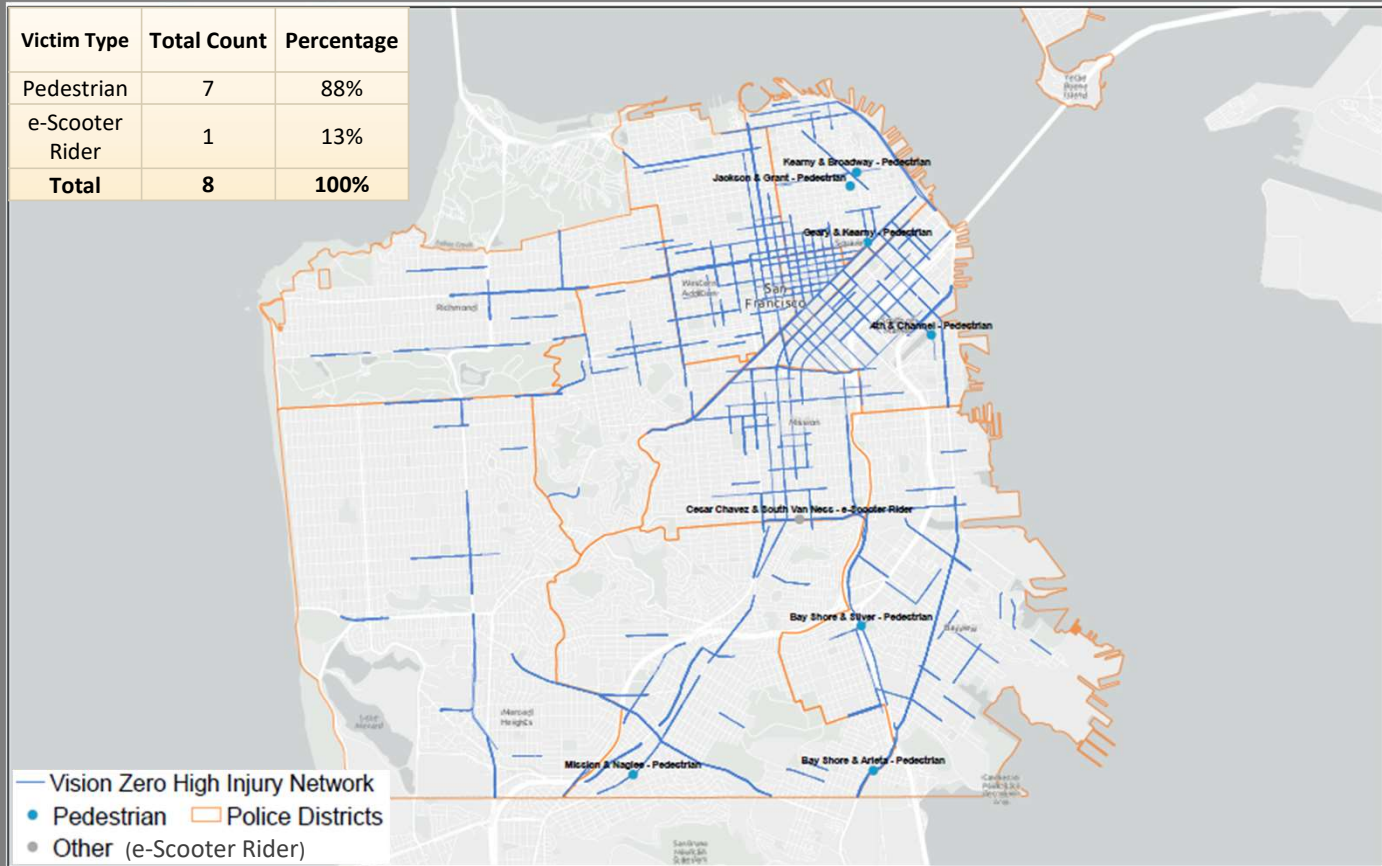
