The Contractor shall provide pre-employment psychological evaluations of sworn peace officer positions as required by Section 1031(f) of the California Code of Regulations.

Description Document translation

The Contractor shall provide translation of Court reports, case plans, and other documents that contain confidential information protected by state law, such as juvenile case file information, as required by California law. JPD will provide the youth copies of their court report, case plan, TILP, and Foster Youth Bill of Rights, and ensure those items are translated in the youth's primary language, if English is not their primary language.
