Process Improvements for 2026

Background: Based on the subcommittee's input and feedback in 2025, COIT staff developed guardrails to establish a more comprehensive evaluation system for technology investments that ensure consistent, strategic, and financially responsible decision-making across all city departments. COIT staff introduced revised budget instructions to departments.

Revised Budget Instructions	
In the Past	New Updates
No list of active projects with details beyond budget	Depts must submit all active technology projects.
Threshold for technology projects was \$100,000	The threshold for technology projects is now \$500,000
Limited standardization & definitions for project proposals	Introduced standards for tech proposals to ensure consistent reporting across all IT projects

New Standardized Requirements

- All proposals must include a problem statement and solution
- Depts must classify projects to the new four-level scale (next slide)
- Depts must submit a detailed project management plan
- Depts develop an ongoing maintenance and support structure that focuses on operationalizing costs
- Depts identify compliance requirements and create a policy framework for implementation
- Detail all potential expenses for visibility into how funds will be utilized
- Create a project schedule that includes a comprehensive and realistic timeline
- Depts clearly document key assumptions, constraints, and risks underlying the project plan
- Depts create a contingency framework to address potential issue types

Organizational Structure & Method

Background: This year, departments propose projects based on levels of complexity to ensure appropriate resource allocation and oversight. Since departments must classify proposed projects according to the four-level complexity scale shown below, this year the meetings will be organized based on this structure with Level (1) being the first to present to the committee.

Level 1: Simple (< \$500K, < 6 months)

- Single Department Impact
- Minimal integration requirements
- Standard procurement processes
- Low technical risk

Level 2: Moderate (\$1M - \$1.5M, 6-12 months)

- Multi-department coordination
- Moderate system integration
- Custom configuration required
- Medium technical/operational risk

Level 3: Complex (\$1.5M - \$3M, 12-24 months)

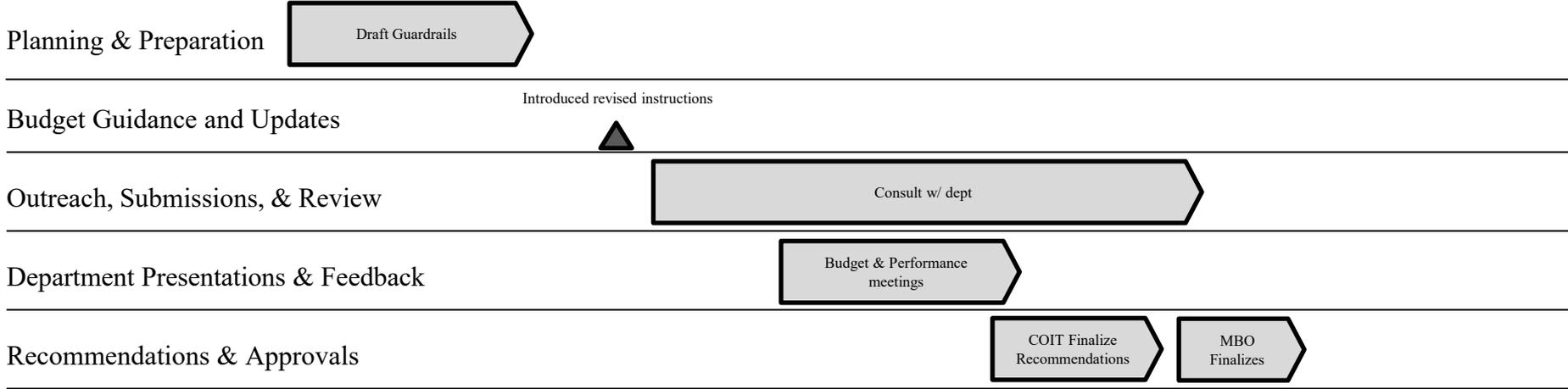
- Enterprise-wide impact
- Significant system integration
- High stakeholder coordination
- Custom Development

Level 4: Transformational (>\$3M, +24 months)

- City-wide transformation
- Legacy system replacement
- Extensive change-management
- Critical infrastructure impact
