Hello, SF Government officials.

I have lived in San Francisco more than two decades, own a small business here, and am active in my community. I'm writing because I'm so concerned about SFPD being present at SFO on March 22 for federal immigration enforcement. The statements put out by the Mayor, SFO, and SFPD are deeply concerning and unsatisfactory.

SFPD's Department General Order (DGO) 5.20 prohibits assisting ICE. SFPD's August 2025 Department Notice 25-089 contradicted DGO 5.15 by allowing officers to assist ICE by "maintaining a perimeter" and "directing traffic." The notice should never have been allowed. Many other cities have excellent examples of how Sanctuary is protected by local law enforcement - not undermined. I know that numerous community groups and city commissions have provided you with examples of how police policy could be written in alignment with Sanctuary and DGO 5.20.

- I ask you to investigate why SFPD was there, what they did, and what happened to the people involved. Please publicly share the investigation findings, such as in a Police Commission meeting open session, Board of Supervisors meeting, or Mayoral town hall.
- I also ask that you share how you will prevent the misuse of City resources and undermining of Sanctuary in the future, particularly by ending SFPD's assistance to federal immigration enforcement through maintaining a perimeter and directing traffic.
