3. FILM SF STAFF REPORT

DISCUSSION

By Executive Director Manijeh Fata, Deputy Director Sofia Alicastro, Production Manager Mark Hogains, Senior Production Coordinator Ismael Castillo, and Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Zoe Halsne.

- Report on recent/upcoming meetings, events, festivals, and productions
- Production stats

Executive Director Fata: Congratulations to Commissioner Cheng on being awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award at the San Francisco Charity Cultural Services Center gala. Our department is merging with Grants for the Arts and the Arts Commission. There are 3 arts community convenings for stakeholders and organizations to hear updates on



next steps for this department. The Commission Streamlining Taskforce's preliminary recommendation is to keep the Film Commission. Their report will be published in April. Thank you to the commissioners who made public comment at the Taskforce's meeting last month. The California On Location Awards (COLAs) have announced this year's finalists. Several Locations professionals have been nominated for Location Team of the Year, Location Manager of Year, and Public Employee of the Year.

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: Executive Director Fata was interviewed by CBS about the state of local film and specifically about a recent production involving a motorized cable car and high-level talent.

Deputy Director Alicastro: Last week we hosted a film industry mixer at Savoy Tivoli, a film-friendly legacy business in North Beach. We are co-presenting a 10th anniversary screening of *The Diary of a Teenage Girl* on November 4 at the Roxie Theater.

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: Welcome to our fall interns, Diana Advani and Anacani Serrato. Diana Advani is an emerging filmmaker and storyteller. She studied computer science and creative writing at UC Berkeley before beginning her career as a software engineer. While working in tech, she deepened her passion for narrative and visual storytelling by completing graduate-level screenwriting classes at the Academy of Art. Diana is now pursuing a career in the arts.

Production Manager Hogains: Anacani Serrato is a Bay Area native and first-generation Mexican American filmmaker and screenwriter. Passionate about character driven stories that explore resilience, identity, and human connection. She is currently developing an indie drama set in San Francisco and excited to grow through this internship.

Senior Production Coordinator Castillo: From September 29-October 26, 2024, we had 18 productions, 46 shoot days, and \$840,000 in estimated spend in San Francisco. This same time in 2025 we had 22 productions, 39 shoot days, and \$1.1 million estimated spend in San Francisco. The increase in spend is due to high budget commercials. Some production highlights include the feature film *Maintenance Required* which is now available on Amazon Prime, and a web series called *Where the Chefs Eat* featuring local chef Samin Nosrat.

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: We also permitted a commercial for the upcoming Pokémon Tournament. Upcoming film festivals include San Francisco Short Film Festival, Cine+Mas San Francisco Latino Film Festival, Green Film Festival, SF Dance Film Fest, Doc Stories, and San Francisco Silent Film Festival. All About Evil is screening at the Roxie, and Fairyland is screening both at the Balboa and the





Roxie. Our followers on Instagram have increased to over 4200. Our final 2025 commission meetings will be on November 17 and December 17.

Commissioner Comment:

Commissioner Tyler: Does the website list current or upcoming productions?

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: We have a list of completed productions on our website.

Commissioner Tyler: Can you inform commissioners about active productions?

Executive Director Fata: Everything we work on is a public record. If there is a question that comes up, reach out to us.

Commissioner Tyler: If there is a major production, commissioners should be informed. I often get asked about productions I don't know about.

Executive Director Fata: Any media requests should go through our office and needs to be run by our external affairs team. We will inform commissioners of upcoming productions in our commission meetings.

Commissioner Kahn: I agree with Commissioner Tyler and I understand where Executive Director Fata is coming from. We shouldn't wait until a commission meeting to be informed about productions. We should have a spreadsheet.

Executive Director Fata: Let's think about it. We should consult with our City Attorney.

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: We inform District Supervisors when there is a high-impact production filming in their district. Perhaps we could include Commissioners in that notification process.

Commissioner Finn: I agree with Commissioner Tyler and Commissioner Kahn. I would like to promote filming in the city, like the Mayor does on his social media.

Executive Director Fata: From a studio and production perspective, we want to be thoughtful about what is shared in advance of the production's release.

Commissioner Kahn: I agree, but is there a way you can share with the commission like you do with the Supervisors?





Executive Director Fata: Yes. We just want to be thoughtful about what we post on social media.

Commissioner Finn: Yes, anything high level we'd want to know.

Executive Director Fata: Let's talk about it.

Commissioner Beaumonte: A lot of productions require NDAs—they don't even want the name of the production out there.

Commissioner Delorio: We just need surface level information.

Commissioner Hernandez: I agree. We should have the Mayor do a set visit and post on social media.

Commissioner Finn: He's great at creating buzz for the city.

Commissioner Kahn: If I was a filmmaker and the Mayor showed up, I'd be in a lot of trouble. We just need to be privy to the same information that the Supervisors are.

President Wang: We should turn this into an action item to look into sending notices to commissioners. We should be thoughtful about marketing strategies and goals.

Assistant Executive Director Escobedo, Local SAG-AFTRA: Year to date we've had 204 members hired for commercials, 7 for corporate and educational, 46 for interactive video games, and 405 for TV and theatrical and new media streaming series. That's a total of 662 hires compared to 1213 this time last year. We are still digging into the data to understand why our numbers are lower and will have a robust report by the end of the year.

Commissioner Kahn: Is there anything the commission can do?

Assistant Executive Director Escobedo, Local SAG-AFTRA: Everything that is on your agenda and that you've been discussing is helpful, especially revamping the *Scene in San Francisco* incentive program.
