3. BAVC MEDIA FILM SPACE GRANT PRESENTATION

DISCUSSION

By Dawn Valadez, Director of Youth & Artistic Development, and Kailen Sallander, Research & Development Manager. They presented their report on the San Francisco Film Commission Film Space (SFFCFS) grant.

Manager Sallander: Over the last year, we expanded the BAVC MediaMaker Connect Residency so that it could be an in-person residency for local filmmakers. They also get free access to additional workshops, monthly meetups, and equipment. We currently host 6 residents in this program and have had over 10 events this year.





Director Valadez: Support from Film SF has been invaluable in the creation of the BAVC Media Connect Residency. Program staff provide a welcoming space for discussing projects, problem-solving, and being in community. As a facility, BAVC Media is now fully open and operates a range of in-person programming. Local filmmakers make use of the space to create, plan, and meet with each other. We know that filmmaking can be very isolating, and having a central, easily accessible location, with industry-standard technology and knowledgeable crew provides a one-stop shop for emerging and veteran filmmakers alike.

Manager Sallander: We're thrilled to share our programs with you and grateful for your continued support.

Commissioner Comment:

Executive Director Fata: Thank you so much for coming today. For context, this is BAVC Media's final report for the San Francisco Film Commission Film Space (SFFCFS) grant for the last fiscal year. SFFILM gave their final report for this grant in June. We are continuing this grant for one year. We are going to look at how to grow our funding with the upcoming arts merger. This grant is not just about providing space for filmmakers—it's also about professional development, mentorship, and community building.

Commissioner Beaumonte: So you have 6 in-person residents?

Director Valadez: Yes.

Commissioner Beaumonte: Are the residencies one year long?

Manager Sallander: Yes.

Commissioner Beaumonte: And they meet once a month?

Manager Sallander: Yes. Director Valadez hosts the meet-ups. But they also have additional opportunities to engage.

Director Valadez: We're generally open Monday through Friday, 9am-5pm. I meet with residents on Wednesday evenings, and we occasionally have events over the weekend. We've worked with at least 17 schools for our youth programs, and our residents are all adults. Most residents are in their 30s or 40s but there are a range of ages. We work with all ages.

Commissioner Beaumonte: Do you help them find jobs?





Director Valadez: We provide skill training to get into college. We also have an editing apprenticeship program. We have partnerships with film, media, and tech companies to help with job placement.

Vice President Song: How is BAVC incorporating AI tools?

Director Valadez: I want to make sure our youth filmmakers understand story structure and how to make a film. We are working on how to engage with AI and have our filmmakers understand where AI is already embedded in the programs they use. We're encouraging people to explore these tools.

Manager Sallander: We've been trying to incorporate emerging technologies in general in our workshop offerings.

4. CONSIDERATION TO APPROVE LETTER OF SUPPORT TO PRESERVE THE COMMISSION IN THE ARTS AGENCY MERGER PROCESS

DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE ACTION

This was to approve a letter to the Commission Streamlining Taskforce on preserving the commission in the arts agency merger process.

Commissioner Comment:

Commissioner Cheng: What does preservation mean in this context?

Vice President Song: The Commission Streamlining Task Force staff recommended to either eliminate the Film Commission or to combine it with the Arts Commission. This letter supports preserving the Film Commission as a separate entity through the arts merger process.





Executive Director Fata: The Commission Streamlining Task Force will discuss and vote on the staff recommendations on October 1. They also said this decision could be delayed due to the ongoing arts merger process.

Commissioner Cheng: The title of the letter implies we have accepted the film commission's fate.

Commissioner Beaumonte: I don't think we have accepted it. We need to know the process of the arts merger and our role in it.

Commissioner Tyler: This letter discusses keeping the Film Commission as a distinct body. I sent a letter to the Task Force to keep the Film Commission, not to merge with the Arts Commission. We play a singular role in this community.

Vice President Song: There are two aspects to this—the arts merger, and the Commission Streamlining Task Force staff recommendation. The letter is in response to the staff recommendation. We should take out "arts agency merger process".

Commissioner Patel: The arts agency merger process is being managed by the Mayor's Office. The Task Force is separate from that. So the Task Force could make a decision on whether to keep the Film Commission or not, or they could defer that decision to be part of the arts merger process.

Commissioner Tyler: Can we remove the language where it says "arts agency merger process"?

Commissioner Cheng: I recommend simplifying the title to just "Urging Preservation of the San Francisco Film Commission".

Vice President Song: We should remove "arts agency merger process" wherever it is mentioned.

Commissioner Cheng: We should also remove "intact" from the last paragraph.

Vice President Song: It should be rephrased to match the title of the letter.

Unanimous vote to approve the letter support with suggested edits.

5. FILM SF STAFF REPORT

DISCUSSION

By Executive Director Manijeh Fata, Deputy Director Sofia Alicastro, Production Manager Mark Hogains, and Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Zoe Halsne.

This report included:

- Report on recent/upcoming meetings, events, festivals, and productions
- Production stats

Executive Director Fata: Governor Newsom signed the budget, which included a huge increase to the California Film & TV Tax Credit Program as well as legislature for changes to this program. I attended the Association of Film Commissioners International (AFCI) Cineposium, a conference for film commissioners around the world. Three other commissioners from California attended. There was a workshop from Bloomberg Associates about economic development in relation to the film industry. There was also an evening with George Clooney. Attending the Cineposium made it clear we need to change the narrative and perception of filming in California. We met with the consultants that have done a lot of research on studying and looking at other cities' arts and cultures departments. There will be community listening sessions about the arts merger.

Deputy Director Alicastro: We had our first quarterly mixer at Avocados and Coconuts in June. We hosted San Francisco Film Trivia Night at the San Francisco Public Library with Commissioner Finn. Bay Area Film Mixer is hosting a mixer on September 30, and Film SF's next film industry mixer is on October 22. There will also be a 10th anniversary screening of *The Diary of a Teenage Girl* on November 4. Our Impact Report for fiscal year 2024-2025 is live on our website.

Production Manager Hogains: From fiscal years 2006-2025, we've had 46 productions use the *Scene in San Francisco* incentive program. Five productions used the incentive in fiscal year 2024-2025. In the same fiscal year we had 9 entry-level local hires through the First Source Hiring Program, and so far for fiscal year 2025-2026 we've had 8 hires.

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: From May 22 to September 28, 2024, we had 89 productions, 177 shoot days, and \$7.8 million estimated production spend in San Francisco. This same time this year we had 104 productions, 202 shoot days, and \$12.9 million estimated spend. Recent production highlights include feature film *The Invite*, a Red Bull stunt on the Bay Bridge, and the Nintendo store opening. Upcoming film festivals include Mill Valley Film Festival, UNAFF2025 International Documentary Film Festival, San Francisco Short Film Festival, Green Film Festival, and SF Dance Film Fest. Upcoming San Francisco movie screenings include





Invasion of the Body Snatchers and Fairyland. We now have over 4200 followers on Instagram. The Commission Streamlining Task Force Meeting will be October 1, and the next Film Commission Meeting is on October 27.

Commissioner Comment:

Vice President Song: Are we community partners with any of the film festivals?

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: We are a community partner with Mill Valley Film Festival.

Commissioner Tyler: Are we sponsoring anything?

Senior Production Coordinator/Commission Secretary Halsne: No, as of now we are just a community partner.

Vice President Song: I will be attending the Mill Valley Film Festival.

Public Comment:

Assistant Executive Director Escobedo, Local SAG-AFTRA: Our numbers are down compared to last year, with 837 total local hires year-to-date 2025. We had 1,148 local hires year-to-date 2024.

Kali Harrison, IATSE Local 600: Thank you to the Film Commission for your leadership, support, and collaboration on the passed California Film & TV Tax Credit Program





updates. We appreciate the Commission's role in creating new opportunities for both local workers and incoming productions. Thank you to Commissioner Beaumonte for Local 16 support. Local 600's focus is on opportunity, sustainability, and excellence. We look forward to continued collaboration with the Commission and other stakeholders to make San Francisco a premiere production destination with a thriving local talent pool and global reach.
