We wish to pay our respects by acknowledging the ancestors, elders, and relatives of the Ramaytush Community and by affirming their sovereign rights as First Peoples.

The San Francisco Finance Corporation will hear up to three minutes of public comment on each agenda item. The San Francisco Finance Corporation will hear public comment on each item in the order that commenters add themselves to the queue to comment on the item. Because of the three-minute time

limit, it is possible that not every person in the queue will have an opportunity to provide public comment. Public comment from people who have received accommodation due to disability (as described below) will not count toward the three-minute limit.
