IMMIGRANT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS GRANT CATEGORIES:

1. FOCUSED IMMIGRANT COMMUNITY PROJECTS

This grant area includes categories and opportunities for the implementation of a broad range of projects that include various vulnerable communities, regardless of immigration status. Services and projects will provide a range of services, including capacity building and support services, workforce development initiatives, and outreach and education. Categories are:

- **COALITION SERVICES TO SAN FRANCISCO COMMUNITIES, INCLUDING ASIAN PACIFIC ISLANDER (API) COMMUNITIES**
- **ASSISTANCE & SERVICES FOR IMMIGRANT UNION MEMBERS**
- **CAPACITY BUILDING FOR SERVICE ORGANIZATION COLLABORATION, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ORGANIZATIONS SERVING THE LATINO COMMUNITY**
- **IMMIGRANT WORKERS PROGRAM**
- **IMMIGRANT PARENT VOTING OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT IN SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS**



2. DACA & AFFIRMATIVE IMMIGRATION SERVICES

This program seeks to fund community organizations to provide affirmative immigration legal services, general screenings, and community navigation and education support for immigrants, regardless of immigration status, currently eligible for immigration programs, including but not limited to Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), or eligibility for future immigration programs. Those supported by this project must live, work, or have demonstrated connection to San Francisco. Categories in this area include:

- **DACA & AFFIRMATIVE IMMIGRATION LEGAL SERVICES**
- **COMMUNITY NAVIGATION SERVICES**
- **IMMIGRATION POLICY TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE**
- **COORDINATION & SUPPORT FOR GROUP PROCESSING WORKSHOPS**

Requirements

Proposers for all programs must be 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations based in the City and County of San Francisco (the City). Program activities must be conducted in San Francisco and will be focused on assisting individuals who live, work, or attend school in the City. Selected grantees must be City-compliant suppliers that demonstrate cultural and linguistic competence; have a history of assisting and serving San Francisco communities; demonstrate extensive knowledge of neighborhood services, issues, and resources; and demonstrate credibility and capacity to reach target populations.
