


SFAC CDRC PHASE 3 742 Arrival View








Item 8: Removal of the Vaillancourt Fountain




Motion to approve the removal of the Embarcadero Fountain by Armand Vaillancourt (SFAC Accession No. 1971.46) to protect the health and safety of residents and visitors from the identified structural deterioration and move it to storage, following the provision of required notice to the artist and interested members of the community under the California Art Preservation Act, to allow for further investigation of the extent of deterioration to the physical structure, and consideration of possible restoration, repair, relocation, repurposing or other future actions relating to the fountain; and to affirm the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act that this action is statutorily exempt from further review under Section 15269 of the CEQA Guidelines. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the project for the purposes of CEQA, pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h).














Figure 15: Current Precast Frame




Figure 16: Analysis model with Showing Meshed Concrete and steel Elements.



Figure 11: Vaillancourt Fountain – Showing Corroded End Plate and Absence of Thru Rod and Spalled Concrete Surface





