Serious Incident Review Board

In the 3rd Quarter of 2025 (Part 1), the Serious Incident Review Board reviewed the following completed Covered Incidents:

- OIS 24-001
- UOF 24-001

Officer-Involved Shooting 24-001

On May 23rd, 2024, at approximately 1510 hrs., dispatch broadcasted an “A” priority “221” call for service (person with a gun). Dispatch advised at Ingalls Street and Armstrong Avenue; there was a white male wearing a camo skirt walking towards Double Rock with an AK-47. Several units responded to the area.

As the first responding officers arrived, they approached the location, and they came across witnesses that advised them of the suspect’s direction of travel and that they believed the suspect was in possession of a gun. As the officers started to approach the suspect with their PUV (Westbound Carroll Avenue), they announced on the PA system, “San Francisco Police” and told the suspect to turn around. The suspect ignored their commands and kept walking away from them.

As the suspect reached the corner of Jennings Street and Carroll Avenue, additional officers arrived on the scene. The suspect proceeded to walk southbound on Jennings Street ignoring the officers’ commands to stop.

One officer was able to see that the suspect was carrying a crossbow and not an AK-47. The officer broadcasted their observation so that the other officers were aware of the weapon.

Officer-Involved Shooting 24-001 (cont'd)

Two officers exited their PUV and walked to the corner of Jennings Street and Carroll Avenue. The suspect continued to ignore officers' commands to drop the crossbow and kept walking southbound on Jennings Street.

Several officers re-entered their vehicles and followed the suspect down Jennings Street. When the suspect stopped walking near the intersection of Jennings Street and Donner Avenue, the officers stopped their vehicles, forming a line across Jennings Street. Officers quickly exited their vehicles, forming a horizontal line formation between the vehicles.

The suspect was given the "Red Light Admonition" and several commands to drop the crossbow. The suspect continued to ignore all commands.

The suspect was now facing eastbound towards Donner Avenue. The suspect was holding the crossbow with their right hand and pointing it at the ground. The suspect suddenly started to pivot their body to the left, in the direction of the officers. At the same time, the suspect reached down with their left hand, grabbed the foregrip and began to raise the crossbow up (from vertical to horizontal). Fearing that the suspect was about to discharge the crossbow at them, Officer #1 discharged their department issued firearm. Simultaneously, Officers #3 and #4 discharged their ERIWs.

Use of Force 24-001

On August 5th, 2024, SFPD officers assigned to the Real Time Investigation Center (RTIC) broadcasted information on a stolen black Chevy Malibu. Tenderloin Plainclothes officers located the vehicle driving on McAllister Street and broadcasted its location and direction of travel. Several marked units responded to assist Officer #1 with conducting a traffic stop on the vehicle.

At 10th Street, just south of Jessie Street, the stolen Malibu got stuck in traffic. This allowed backup officers to pass the Malibu and deploy Spike Strips. Upon seeing the officers, the driver of the Malibu exited the vehicle and immediately fled on foot northbound on 10th Street to eastbound on Jessie Street.

Several officers that had responded to the scene, quickly exited their vehicles and pursued the suspect eastbound on Jessie Street.

Use of Force 24-001 (cont'd)

Officer #2 quickly caught up to the suspect and tackled them to the ground. Once on the ground, Officers #1, #3 and #4 quickly placed the suspect into handcuffs.

Officer #1: Assisted with handcuffing (No reportable force)

Officer #2: Tackle (Reportable Force)

Officer #3: Figure Four control hold of legs (No reportable force)

Officer #4: Assisted with handcuffing (No reportable force)

Use of Force 24-001 (cont'd)

Shortly after being placed into handcuffs, the suspect complained of pain to their right hip area. An ambulance was summoned, and the suspect was transported to a local hospital. The suspect was diagnosed with a hairline fracture to his hip and admitted out of an abundance of caution.
