BOOKING/CITING

Once a youth (11 to 17) is in police custody, members follow the below procedures:

Youth Interviews

- Miranda Rights are read per California Government Code Sec. 625, SF Admin Code Chapter 96C, SFPD policy DGO 7.01, DB20-006, DN 22-043
 - Police are prohibited from any unnecessary conversations with a detained youth about the crime unless they are represented by a Public Defender.
 - After consultation with Public Defender, the youth is allowed to request a responsible adult be present.
 - Members are allowed to provide procedural information about transportation options.

Notifications

- Responsible adult (defined in policy) is notified youth is in custody.
- The Community Assessment and Referral Center (CARC) is notified and given information related to the youth and the associated violation.



DIVERSION

The Diversion Process begins once CARC is notified.

Community Assessment and Referral Center (CARC)

 CARC contacts Juvenile Probation Department (JPD) who oversees the juvenile arrest process.

JPD instructs CARC to do the following

Misdemeanor Cases

- Referred back to CARC
- CARC will be responsible for the follow up with diversion programs.
 - Youths must enter into the diversion programs voluntarily
 - Successful completion = case is close
 - Unsuccessful completion = referral back to Juvenile Probation for follow up

Felony Cases

- Requires the youth to be cited/booked
- Juvenile Probation will follow up with the youth



FELONY CASES

Felony cases are processed and handled by Juvenile Probation

Youth 12 to 13 years

Can be diverted back to CARC at the discretion of JPD

Youth 14 to 17 years

Are handled by Juvenile DA office for charging.

Juvenile DA

Can charge/discharge the case or offer pre-trial diversion with no court appearance

Juvenile Courts

Can hear the case or offer post-trial diversion.

As a collaborative partnership with CARC, Juvenile DA, and Juvenile Courts, Juvenile Probation is actively involved from start to finish.


