
GUN VIOLENCE – CITYWIDE

GUN VIOLENCE: Total gun violence is DOWN 41% compared to 2025

- There were NO firearm-related shooting incidents causing injuries to 0 victims the week ending 02.08.26
 - For the year, there are a total of 8 firearm-related incidents resulting in 10 victims

TOTAL HOMICIDES: Homicides are UP 300% compared to 2025




- There was 1 homicide incident reported the week ending 02.08.26**



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
