**Chief's Report**

- **Weekly crime trends**
- **Major/Significant Incidents**

Chief Lew stated that it is an honor to be Chief of Police and is looking forward to working with the Commission in partnership. Chief Lew reported on the year-end recap for 2025: Overall crime down 25%; violent crime down 18%; property crime down 27%; End-of-year total: Violent crimes: 28 homicides, lowest number since 1954. Homicide Unit had a 125% clearance rate, cleared

34 homicides either by arrest or other means; gun violence, down 14%. Robberies, down 24% which included a 45% decrease in robberies with a firearm. Assaults, down 12%, with assaults involving a firearm down 19%; rapes down 17%; human trafficking up 18% with 24 incidents reported in 2025. Property crimes: burglaries down 28%; motor vehicle thefts down 44%; arson down 9%. Larceny, down 22% overall which includes retail theft and car break-ins down 42%. Recovered firearms – 1,017 firearms; 6,683 arrests related to drugs; seized over 56 lbs. of Fentanyl. Staffing: short around 690 sworn members.

Significant Incidents: No homicides reported. Two reported shootings: One in the Bayview on December 30<sup>th</sup>, 6 a.m., in the area of Toland Place and McKeenon, victim shot (non-fatal), no arrest made; Second in the Ingleside on December 31<sup>st</sup>, 10:42 a.m., in the area of Alemany and Elmsworth, officers responded and located a crime scene. Later on two victims with gunshot wounds self-transported to SFGH, no arrest made.

Notable Arrests: Carjacking in the Central District on New Year's day, 6:40 a.m., in the area of O'Farrell and Stockton. The vehicle was located in Sunnydale, RTIC (Real Time Investigations Center) was instrumental in making this arrest.

Major Events: First Amendment activities – on Saturday, January 3<sup>rd</sup>, approximately 100 people gathered on Market and Powell Streets, regarding opposition to federal action taken in Venezuela, no issues.

Large events in 2025: The department supported, in addition to overall investigative and patrol functions, over 70 major events such as New Year's Eve, 4<sup>th</sup> of July, Pride, Fleet Week, Cinco de Mayo, Chinese New Year, SantaCon, Carnival, DreamForce, NBA Allstars, JP Morgan Chase Healthcare Conference, Mayor's Inauguration and multiple events held in individual districts. These required a lot of scheduling and large resource goes into these events to go into public safety. In 2026, major events include the Superbowl, Pro Bowl, FIFA games, DreamForce, JP Morgan Chase.

**DPA Director's Report**

**- Report on recent DPA activities, and announcement**

Executive Director Henderson reported the following: In the year 2026: 3 cases opened; 8 closed; 190 pending; 0 cases sustained; 13 cases past 270-day; 0 cases mediated. SFPD Cases received in the past weeks (since the last Commission Meeting DPA Report): 7. Central, 13. Southern, 2. Bayview, 11. Mission, 2. Northern, 2. Park, 2. Richmond, 3. Ingleside, 3. Taraval, 15. Tenderloin, 2. Airport, 9. Not Applicable, 4. Out of Jurisdiction, 12. Pending, Allegation Summary: Conduct Unbecoming an Officer- The officer behaved or spoke inappropriately-18%. Neglect of Duty- The officer failed to take required action-20%. Unwarranted Action-The officer engaged in unwarranted action-8%. Unwarranted Action – the officer conducted an improper search or seizure – 6%; Unwarranted Action – the officer detained a person without reasonable suspicion – 5%.

**Audits:** DPA has issued its audit report on SFPD's processes for monitoring use-of-force incidents and is scheduled to present to the Police Commission on February 4<sup>th</sup>.

President Clay announced that the department has provided the Commission a group of DGOs, some going back in the 90s, that the Commission will undertake and review to determine whether or not to update or whether or not it is still viable.

Sergeant Youngblood reported on the closed session roll call vote for the Mayor's appointee, Police Chief Derrick Lew. On Wednesday, November 19, 2025, in closed session, the following Commissioners voted yes to forward Derrick Lew's name to Mayor Lurie: President Clay, Commissioners Lee, Leung, and Tekkey. The following Commissioners voted no: Vice President Benedicto, Commissioners Elias and Scott.

Commissioner Yee reported that on December 3<sup>rd</sup>, the Medal of Valor Awards Ceremony honoring officers that put their lives on the line every day. Commissioner Yee thanked the officers for their courage and thanked President Clay for his work with the Awards Committee. He also congratulated Chief Derrick Lew for his appointment as Chief of Police.

Vice President Benedicto stated it was a privilege to have the entire Commission attend the Medal of Valor Award ceremony and congratulated all the award recipients and congratulated Chief Lew for his appointment and congratulated Assistant Chief Jones for her appointment as Assistant Chief of Police.

Commissioner Scott acknowledged the Medal of Valor Awards ceremony and congratulated all the awards recipients and thanked the officers for doing a tremendous job in keeping the community safe. She also thanked the officers who participated in the Gun Buy Back event where over 274 assault weapons and handguns were taken off the street. Commissioner Scott also announced to the public that if there is a firearm you want removed from your home, the public can contact SFPD and other organizations like United Players.
