## Summary for April 1, 2026

The Department of Police Accountability's highlights for the week:

### ▪ Chief Lew Visited DPA

- DPA staff provided Chief Lew, Assistant Chief Jones, and Deputy Chief Im with an overview of our core functions, including investigations, mediation, audit, policy, and technology.
- We discussed opportunities for collaboration, establishing an important foundation for strengthened coordination in service to the people of this city.

### Investigation Updates:

#### ◆ **Statistics Since the Last Police Commission Meeting (March 18, 2026):**

- **Cases Opened:** 85
- **Cases Closed:** 99
- Year-to-Date Comparison:
  - Volume of incoming complaints has risen and is now about 16% higher than for the same period last year.
  - DPA is completing investigations at a rate that has allowed us to maintain a relatively steady caseload.
  - The number of cases past 270 days is currently 8 and all but one are tolled. This continues to be a historic low.
