1 [Accept and Expend Gift - Retroactive - San Francisco Police Community Foundation - O2X
Wellness Initiative - \$103,750]

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3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Police Department to accept and expend a**
4 **cash gift in the amount of \$103,750 from the San Francisco Police Community**
5 **Foundation to support the Police Department's O2X Wellness Initiative and officer**
6 **wellness programming from April 1, 2026, through June 30, 2026.**

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8 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Community Foundation (SFPCF) is a 501(c)(3)
9 non-profit organization dedicated to supporting the Police Department while helping to
10 strengthen connectivity between officers and the broader communities they serve; and

11 WHEREAS, Officer wellness, physical readiness, resiliency, and mental health support
12 are important to the wellbeing of Department members and the Police Department's ability to
13 provide effective public safety services; and

14 WHEREAS, The Police Department maintains officer wellness initiatives intended to
15 support the health, wellness, readiness, and performance of sworn members; and

16 WHEREAS, The Department's O2X Wellness Initiative provides wellness and
17 readiness resources for Department members, including access to the O2X Integrated
18 Readiness Platform, embedded On-Site Specialists, strength and conditioning support, and
19 related wellness programming; and

20 WHEREAS, The Department previously entered into an agreement with O2X Human
21 Performance, Inc. for officer wellness and readiness services, which was approved by the
22 Civil Service Commission consistent with the City's Personal Services Contract requirements;
23 and

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1 WHEREAS, The Civil Service Commission approval recognized that the services
2 provided through the O2X program require specialized expertise and embedded wellness
3 resources that are not currently performed by existing City personnel; and

4 WHEREAS, SFPCF committed a cash gift in the amount of \$103,750 to support the
5 continuation of the Department's O2X Wellness Initiative; and

6 WHEREAS, The funding is intended to support the period of the O2X program from
7 April 1, 2026, through June 30, 2026, including the O2X Integrated Readiness Platform, two
8 embedded On-Site Specialists, and other direct costs associated with the program; and

9 WHEREAS, The Administrative Code requires City departments to obtain Board of
10 Supervisors' approval to accept and expend gifts with a value of more than \$10,000 pursuant
11 to Administrative Code Section 10.100-305; now, therefore, be it


12 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors retroactively authorizes the Police

15 and officer wellness programming.

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

*The San Francisco Sunshine Ordinance (San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 67), as approved by the San Francisco voters in 1999, provides that:

SEC. 67.29-6. Sources of Outside Funding

No official or employee or agent of the city shall accept, allow to be collected, or direct or influence the spending of , any money, or any goods or services worth more than one hundred dollars in aggregate, for the purpose of carrying out or assisting any City function unless the amount and source of all such funds is disclosed as public record and made available on the website for the department to which the funds are directed. When such funds are provided or managed by an entity, and not an individual, that entity must agree in writing to abide by this ordinance. The disclosure shall include the names of all individuals or organizations contributing such money and a statement as to any financial interest the contributor has involving the City
