



# Weekly Activity Report: San Francisco Department of Police Accountability

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## Summary for July 8, 2026

The Department of Police Accountability's highlights for the week:

- DPA's audit of SFPD's use of automated license plate readers is in progress. DPA initiated this audit in April 2026, and it is currently in the planning phase as we gather information from SFPD to develop the audit plan.
- DPA welcomed Commissioner Larry Low for a meeting with DPA staff to discuss his priorities, learn more about DPA's work, and explore opportunities for continued collaboration.
- DPA staff and interns proudly joined the Mayor's Office in the Juneteenth Parade on June 19th and the 56th Annual San Francisco Pride Parade on June 28th.
- DPA has opened an investigation into incidents that occurred during the San Francisco Trans March on June 26th.

## Investigation Updates:

### ◆ Statistics Since the Last Police Commission Meeting (June 17, 2026):

- **Cases Opened:** 61
- **Cases Closed:** 52
- Year-to-Date Comparison:
  - The volume of incoming complaints is approximately 13% higher than for the same period last year.
  - The number of cases past 270 days is currently 7 and all but one are tolled.
