## Status of Public Records Requests Made Pursuant to Senate Bills 1421 and 16 (SB 1421 and SB 16)

This report provides an update on the status of public record requests and documents produced pursuant to California Penal Code § 832.7, commonly known as “SB 1421 and SB 16 records.”<sup>1</sup> The Department of Police Accountability (DPA) publishes SB 1421 and SB 16 records in an online portal at <https://sfdpa.nextrequest.com/>.

<sup>1</sup> Until January 1, 2022, Penal Code § 832.7 required confidentiality for peace officer personnel records except in four categories: (1) officer involved shooting investigations, (2) uses of force that cause great bodily harm, (3) sustained findings of sexual assault, or (4) sustained findings of dishonesty. Records in these four categories are called “SB 1421” records after the 2019 senate bill that made them disclosable. On January 1, 2022, Senate Bill 16 (“SB 16”) expanded these disclosable categories to include: (5) sustained findings of unreasonable or excessive force, (6) sustained findings of failure to intervene against another officer using excessive force, (7) sustained findings of unlawful arrest or search, and (8) sustained findings of biased policing.
