The Police Commission of the City and County of San Francisco met in Room 400, City Hall, #1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco at 5:36 p.m.

Lieutenant Lange provided a background about Sergeant Farrell and his work, provided words of gratitude and praise.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

Yulanda Williams, OFJ, spoke of Commission meetings in different districts of the city and concerns regarding access by the public to Commission meetings.

Jessica, candidate for District 10 Supervisor, spoke of rescheduling the Commission meetings to avoid conflicts with major sporting events, cultural events, and community gatherings. She went on to speak of recommendations for police investigations.

Unidentified spoke of Juneteenth celebrations in the city and invited that Commissioners to attend on June 19th, at the Heritage Center, 3030 Fillmore Street, to celebrate Juneteenth.

Ace Washington, Fillmore Corridor ambassador, asked for assistance for their event on June 19th at the Heritage Center.

Ms. Paulette Brown spoke of her son, Aubrey Abrakasa, who was a victim of homicide and how his case is still unsolved.

Chief's Report

- **Weekly crime trends**

- **Major/Significant Incidents**

Chief Lew then reported on crime trends YTD: Violent Crimes down 11 percent; homicide, 17 YTD; rape down 10 percent; robbery down 19 percent; assault down 4 percent; human trafficking down 38 percent. Property Crimes down 24 percent; burglary down 26 percent; motor vehicle theft down 26 percent; arson up 2 percent; larceny theft down 23 percent. Gun violence is down 15 percent compared to 2025.

Shooting Incidents: There were two shooting incidents causing injuries to two victims the week ending 6/7/26. There is a total of 41 fatal/non-fatal shooting incidents resulting in 45 victims, 10 homicides, 35 non-fatal.

Homicide Incidents: No homicide incidents reported the week ending 6/7/26.

Significant Incidents: There was a shooting in the Northern on June 6th, at approximately 11:32 p.m. Officers responded to Webster and Turk Street regarding a shooting and located a victim suffering from an apparent gunshot wound. Victim was transported to the hospital with non-life threatening injuries. Case is open and ongoing. On June 2nd, at approximately 11 p.m., officers responded to SFGH Emergency Room to interview a victim with gunshot wounds. Victim provided little information. Officers were unable to locate a crime scene. Case is open and ongoing. The Department is preparing for the FIFA World Cup which starts June 11th to July 19th.

Chief Lew invited the Commissioners to the upcoming 288th Recruit Class Academy Graduation on Monday, June 15th, at 6 p.m., Scottish Rite Center.

Jessica congratulated the Department for no homicides and made recommendations for reports and investigation.

Director Asja Steeves presented Department General Order 3.01, “Department Written Directives.”

Amendments read into the record: “(Clean version of DGO) Section 3.01.05 B(4)(c) Drafting. PDD will consult with the SME to determine what public feedback will be included in Stage III draft and provide responses to every recommendation in the recommendation grid.”

“Section 3.01.05 B(5) – adding a new subsection B(e). *If a Stage II working group occurs, PDD will notify the working group of any substantive changes made during concurrence. This notification shall occur before Commission submission.*”

Motion by Commissioner Tekkey to adopt revised DGO 3.01 with amendments read into the record for use for meeting and conferring with bargaining units. Second by Commissioner Leung. Approved 5-2.

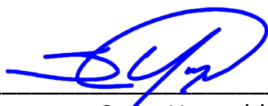
