The Police Commission of the City and County of San Francisco met in Room 400, City Hall, #1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco at 5:36 p.m.

Captain Hall, DMAC, provided a background about Officer Menendez and his work, provided words of gratitude and praise.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Paulette Brown spoke of her son, Aubrey Abrakasa, who was murdered August 14, 2006. She asked for justice for her son and showed the names of the perpetrators: Thompson Hannibal, Paris Moffett, Andrew Videau, Jason Thomas, Anthony Hunter, and Mauric Carter. She spoke of all the unsolved homicides and asked for justice for her son.

Chief's Report

Chief Lew reported that on June 15th, the 288th Recruit class were sworn in consisting of 17 recruits.

Chief Lew then reported on crime trends YTD: Violent Crimes down 12 percent; homicide, 17 YTD; rape down 12 percent; robbery down 20 percent; assault down 5 percent; human trafficking down 31 percent. Property Crimes down 23 percent; burglary down 26 percent; motor vehicle theft down 26 percent; arson up 1 percent; larceny theft down 22 percent.

Shooting Incidents: There are no non-fatal shooting incidents resulting in injuries for the week ending 6/14/26. Gun violence down 17 percent.

Homicide Incidents: No homicide incidents reported the week ending 6/14/26.

Significant Incidents: On June 12th, an arrest was made with partners involving an undercover decoy operation. The suspect arrived to meet with the decoy and as officers moved in to arrest the suspect, suspect ran. Suspect was taken into custody and officers recovered a gun, multiple magazines, and pepper spray. A subsequent search of the suspect's vehicle led to recovery of another firearm, multiple high cap magazines, and large containers of ammunition. On June 12th, officers responded to Trader Joes on California and Hyde. When officers arrived and attempted to detain the suspect, the suspect ran. Officers pursued the suspect on foot and attempted to take him into custody. At that point, a vehicle, unrelated to the event, struck all three persons. The two officers did not suffer serious injuries, but the suspect was deceased at the scene. On June 15th, there was a vehicle collision with a motorcycle officer at approximately 10:34 a.m., on the 900 block of North Access

Road. There was an accident between a semi-truck and the motorcycle officer. The officer suffered no injuries.

Chief Lew reported on upcoming large events including Juneteenth on June 11th, and Pride weekend on June 28th.

Chief Lew reported on ALPR (Automated License Plate Reader) and how it's an everyday tool for officers. ALPR is an efficient way to disseminate information to officers in real time and is a cornerstone for RTIC (Real Time Investigation Center) work. Chief Lew stated that ALPR can be credited to reducing overall crimes and is a big part of what the Department does now in terms of crime fighting efforts. The Chief explained that this technology is used by the Department in a righteous way. He went on to talk about findings from a recent audit. The audit revealed immediate concerns that the ALPR database was queried at the request of out-of-state and federal agencies. The searches were conducted by the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center "NCRIC", an in-state law enforcement agency that SFPD and other agencies throughout California have authorized to access SFPD's ALPR data and other agencies as well. Chief Lew stated that these searches were not conducted by SFPD members. The audit logs revealed that searches conducted through NCRIC's authorized access referenced multiple federal and in-state agencies. SFPD immediately notified NCRIC supervisors and immediately terminated NCRIC's access to SFPD's Flock ALPR network pending further investigation. A comprehensive review of all ALPR data including all NCRIC inquiries of SFPD's ALPR data was performed. Based on NCRIC's investigation, SFPD has learned that the searches were conducted by analysts with the Western States Information Network "WSIN". WSIN has indicated that the analyst who conducted the ALPR searches at the request of other agencies were unaware of California law prohibiting the sharing ALPR data with Federal and out of state agencies. At this time, NCRIC's and WSIN access to SFPD ALPR network remains disabled.

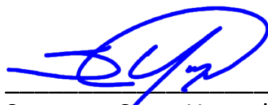
