Victoria Westbrook, Reentry Services Manager for Adult Probation provided an update on the Reentry Council Subcommittee's which included the Reentry Council Retreat that took place Tuesday, March 18th from 1pm - 3pm at 49 South Van Ness. Future meeting dates for the Women's First Subcommittee which took place on June 9th, 2025.

Richard Beal the Chair of the Direct-Action Subcommittee provided an update on the on the Direct Action Subcommittee and future events including the CASC Juneteenth event which took place on June 18th; The Overdose Prevention day which will take place at the end of August; And the Fifth Annual Recovery Day on

September 12th at Boeddeker Park; CASC End of the Year Celebration (TBD); And the Second Annual Overdose Prevention Summit at the SF Main Public Library on Thursday, January 30th 9:15am - 4pm.

6. Presentation on Project Zero by Yoana Tchoukleva, Impact Justice. This presentation was an introduction to the planning grant Impact Justice received to study the existing reentry infrastructure in San Francisco and develop a proposal for how to reduce the rates of recidivism, homelessness and unemployment for individuals released from state prison to San Francisco to 0%.

Impact Justice met with dozens of reentry CBO leaders, including many who represented on the Reentry Council: Episcopal Community Services (ECS), Recovery Survival Network (RSN), Five Keys, HR360, The Way Out, 3rd Street Youth, The Minna Project, Bonafide, Cr8 Innovations. They also spoke with Probation, Parole, GEO, CDCR, and the Freedom Project of the Public Defender's Office and held listening circles with people in different stages of their reentry journeys. Yoana shared data related to reentry and the gaps they were able to identify from the data and their conversations including providing every person with a Reentry Coach who can give them 24/7 support and help them access services and investing in long-term care and provide support for 3-5 years.

Yoana then shared the timeline of proposal and launch which was final research completion, proposal development, partner agreements and then year one implementation beginning in October 2025 and year two in October 2026.

Director Karen Roye asked about the role of family members that are cohabitating with individuals returning from incarceration. Yoana, explained there were potential future opportunities for housing stipends.




