Piece details: Bone & Stone, Ethically sourced Totemic art jewelry piece. 30mm x 15mm Fossilized Equus middle phalanx bone, tumbled, polished and enameled. Facet, jointed surface at top of bone embedded with a 1 carat lab grown, custom cut lab grown diamond and quarter carat cabochon sapphire. Matching blossom pendant is 20mm x 15mm mounted on a 15mm cultured pearl. Custom cut lab grown diamond is ½ a carat. Supported by flanking ½ carat custom cut sapphires. Year of creation 2025. Custom pieces, each design unique based on fossil type, size, natural symmetries, gemstone and geometric symmetries. Measurements vary, bone size is usually an inch to an inch



half. Gemstone sizes from ½ carat to 2 carats. Custom cuts, cabochon shapes based on the bone's jointed surface (facet). The ready made in the photograph is size 6. Size can be adjusted through the use of a dremel with a diamond bit. Piece in second photograph is instilled. Usual size range is 6-7 for Women. 8-9 for Men. 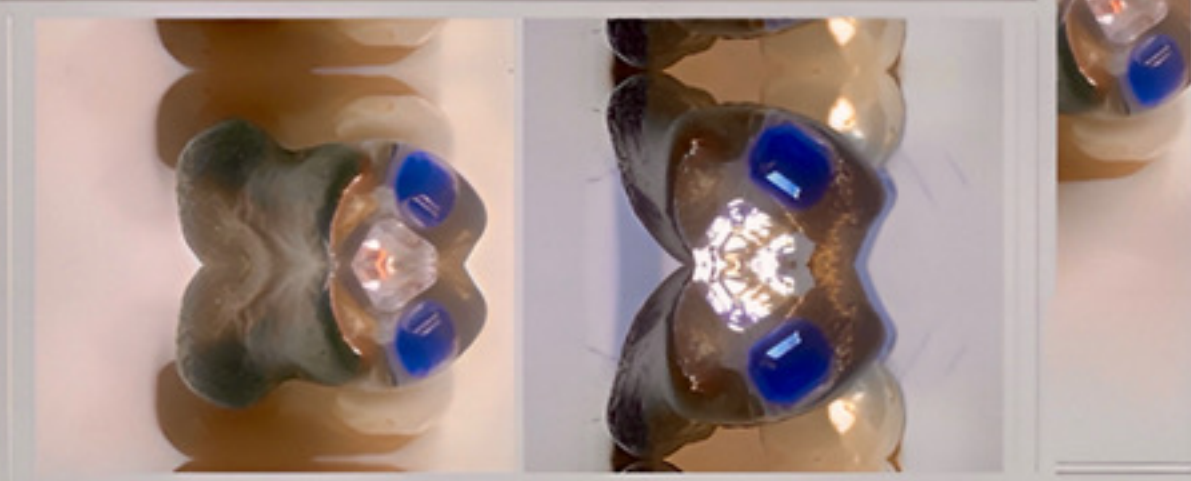
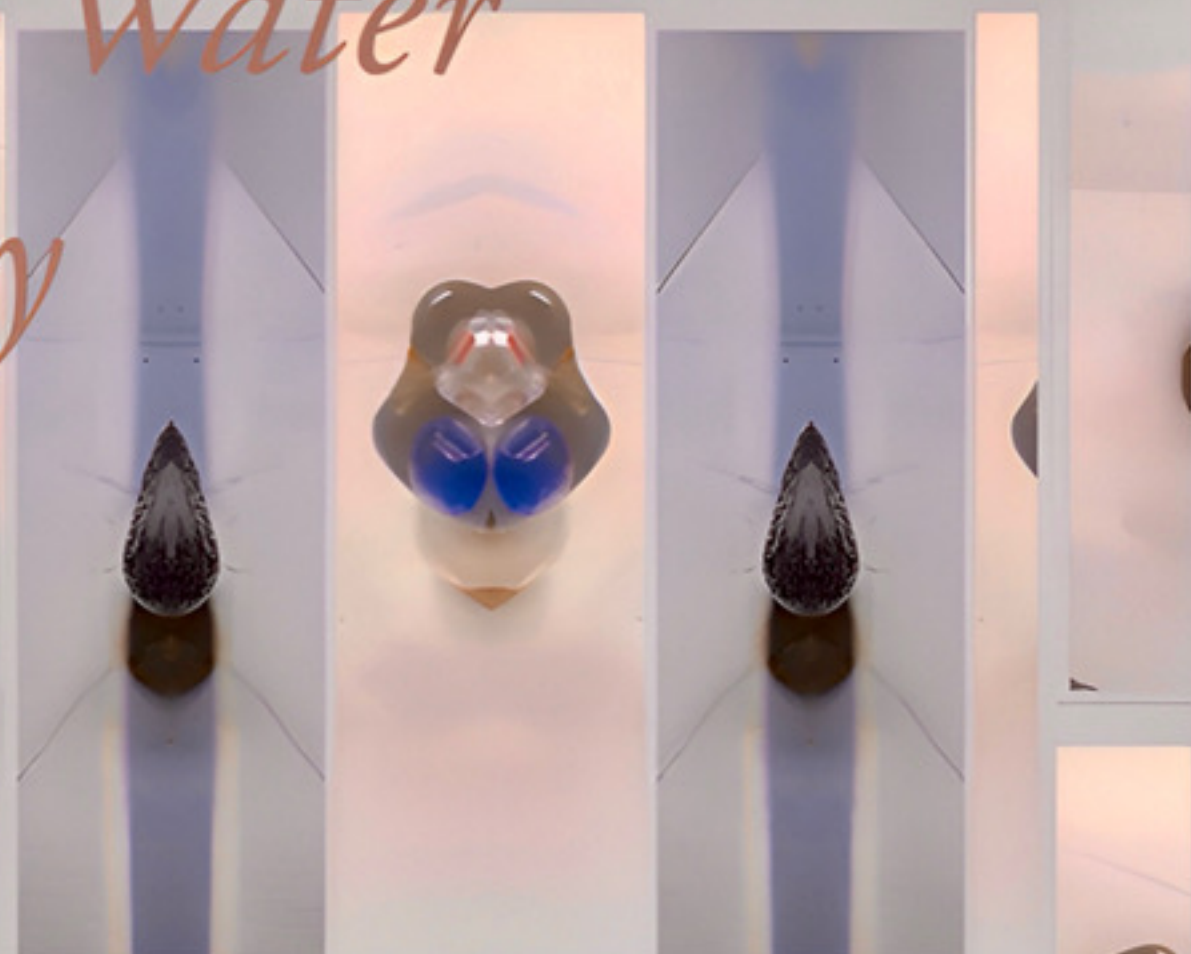
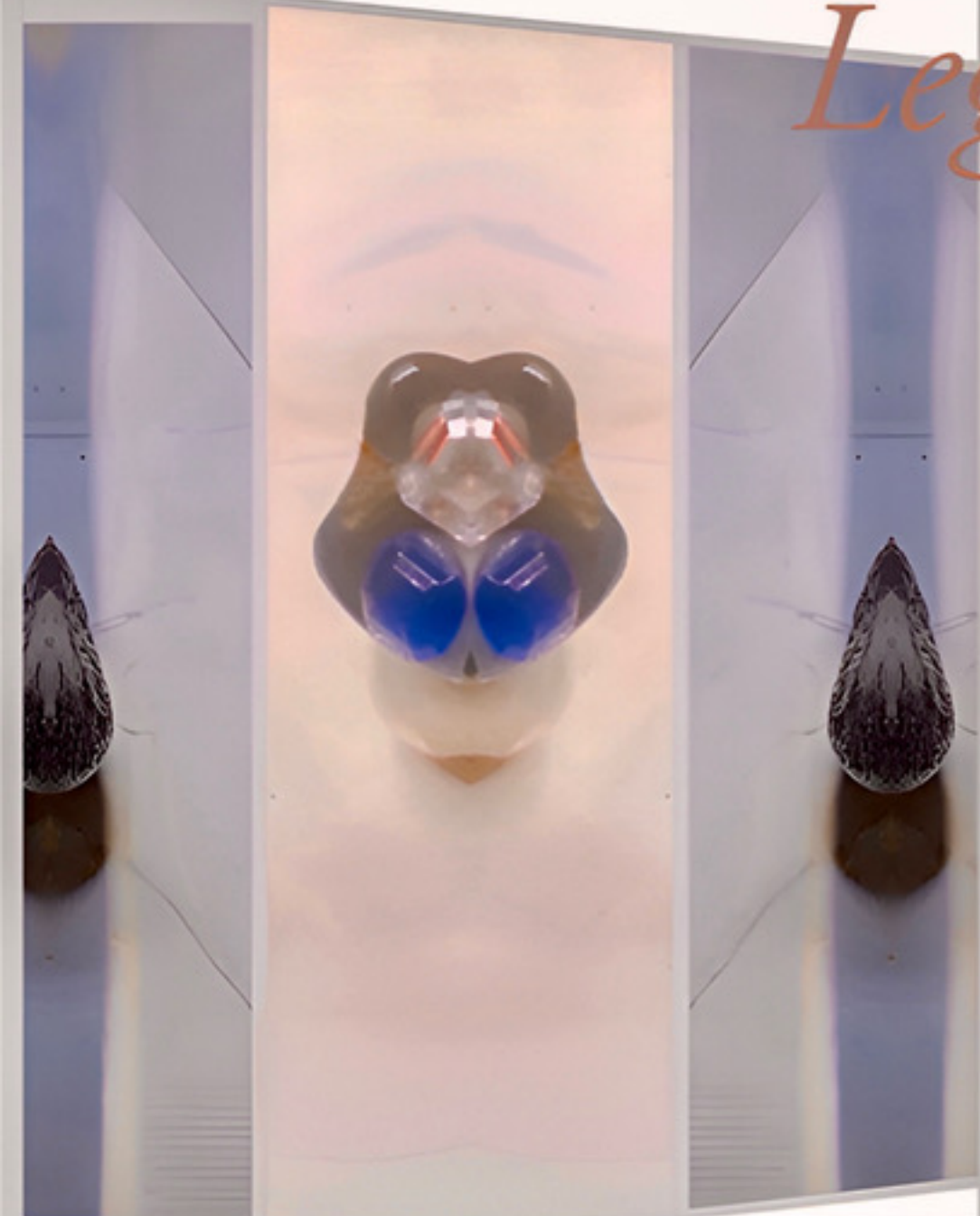
14. Describe the safety procedures you use in your craft. What, if any, safety equipment do you use? How do you store and handle any toxic or hazardous material?

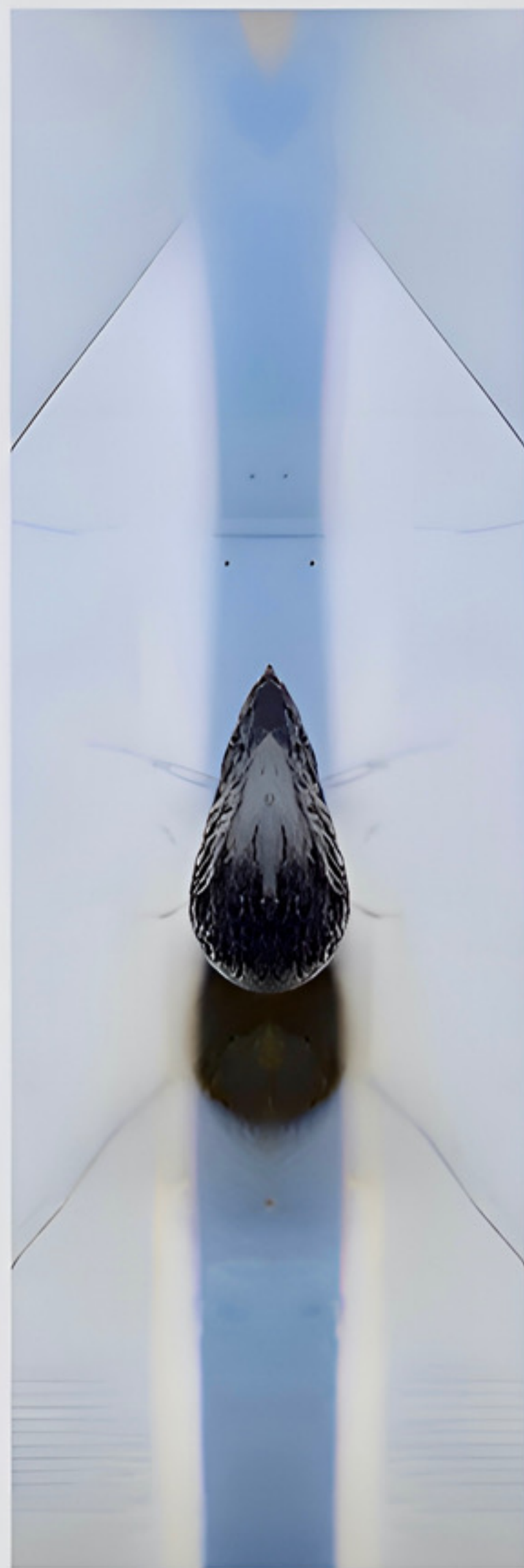
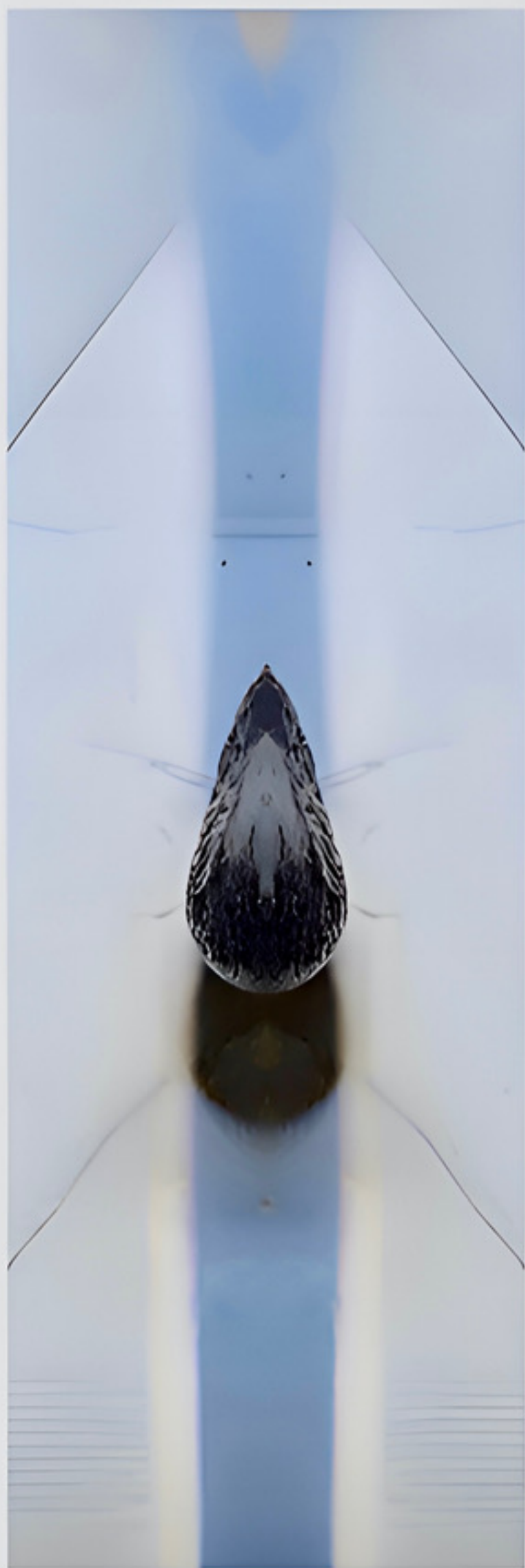


