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Dear BSC,

I am here in room 416 at City Hall to give public comment on the BSC digest of the Sunset Dunes ballot measure, but given last minute shifts to the agenda and my work responsibilities, I am not able to stay several more hours. The BSC told us we could email our comment to this address and have them read aloud in the meeting, whenever it happens several hours from now. Here is my comment (which comes in at under 2 minutes, when read aloud).

Good morning. My name is Heidi. I live in the Outer Sunset with my family. If this was a forum to tell you about how immensely I love Sunset Dunes - I would! I would sing it! But I can't sing. And more relevantly, I'm not here to tell you how to feel about roads versus parks. That's a choice for voters. **I'm here because the current digest doesn't let voters actually make that choice.**

The draft digest describes this measure as simply "reopening" the Upper Great Highway. It never tells voters that doing so requires closing Sunset Dunes Park, and that the Upper Great highway is actually a FORMER roadway. Not usable in its current form.

Sunset Dunes Park and the Upper Great Highway aren't two different places — they're the same stretch of land. The Rec and Park Commission renamed it after Prop K passed. Since then, the city has built a skate park, a bike park, seating, public art installations, children's play areas and fitness equipment right on the former roadway. None of that can coexist with car traffic. To reopen the road, the park has to come out first.

This isn't a new situation for this Council. When you wrote the digests for Props J and K, you told voters plainly what would open and what would close. That's the right way to do it, and it's what you should do here too.

Our parks are important enough that the City Charter requires voters themselves to approve closing one. That authority means nothing if the digest hides that a closure is exactly what's on the ballot.

Please revise the digest so it plainly states: a "yes" vote closes Sunset Dunes Park to reopen a FORMER roadway. Voters deserve to know what they're actually deciding. Thank you for all you do to accurately inform voters!
