I want to submit this public comment on behalf Sunset Dunes:

Good morning Members of the Ballot Simplification Council. My name is Janelle Wong, a long-time Sunset resident and a Sunset Dunes Park supporter. I urge the council to correct the draft digest to clarify that a "yes" vote allowing private vehicles on the Upper Great Highway will permanently close Sunset Dunes Park. This means dismantling a park that saw over 1.7 million visits in its first year alone to reconstruct a road, destroying essential amenities like oceanview seating, picnic areas, a skate and bike park, fitness equipment, hammocks, and the Shipwreck Cove playground.

There is precedent for this language with Propositions J (2022) and K (2024), the digest explicitly laid out what is gained and lost to voters if they vote "yes" or "no" for a measure. The current draft omits that reopening the road eliminates weekday access, when approximately 60% of park visits occur—deeply impacting service, healthcare, hospitality, and retail workers. We appreciate that it is not the council's intent to be biased towards a road or a park, but the omission of the elimination of the park and park amenities fails to fully inform voters.

We respectfully request that the measure be accurately summarized as a choice for voters of whether they wish to cease using Sunset Dunes Park as an open recreation space and eliminate its public amenities in order to reopen the space as a roadway for private vehicles. Thank you.
