## BACKGROUND

**Background:** The SFPD must submit a police district boundary analysis once every 10 years, after the results of the federal decennial census.

An exhaustive analysis was completed in 2024 (link: [San Francisco Police Boundary Analysis 2024 |](#)) and provided to the Police Commission at the end of 2024, which posted publicly in February 2025 (link: [February 19, 2025 Police Commission meeting | SF.gov](#)).

In June of 2025, the commission requested the SFPD conduct additional analysis on recommendations made by the public. Initial analysis was presented to the Police Commission in July. (link: [July 16, 2025 Police Commission meeting | SF.gov](#))



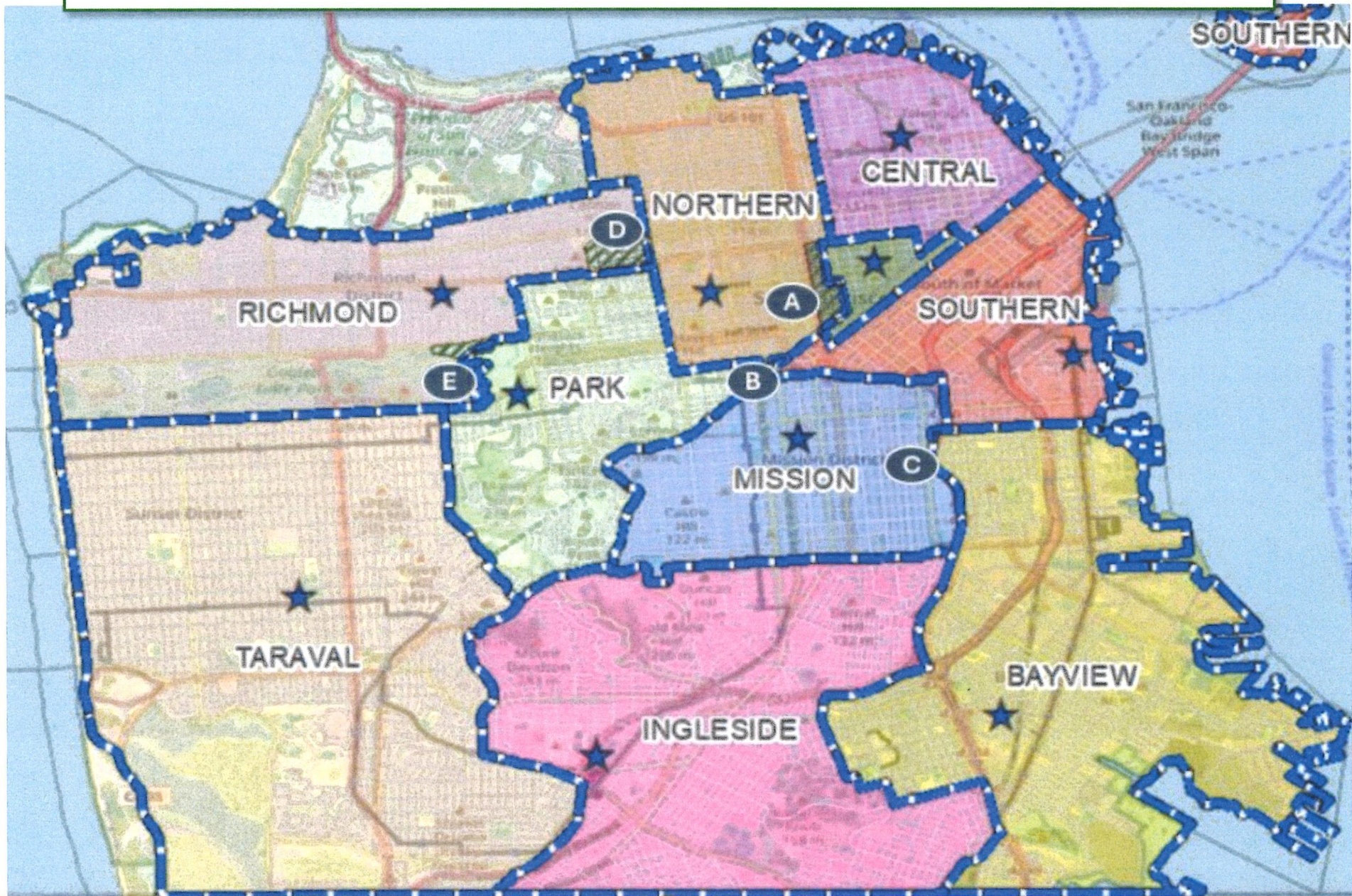

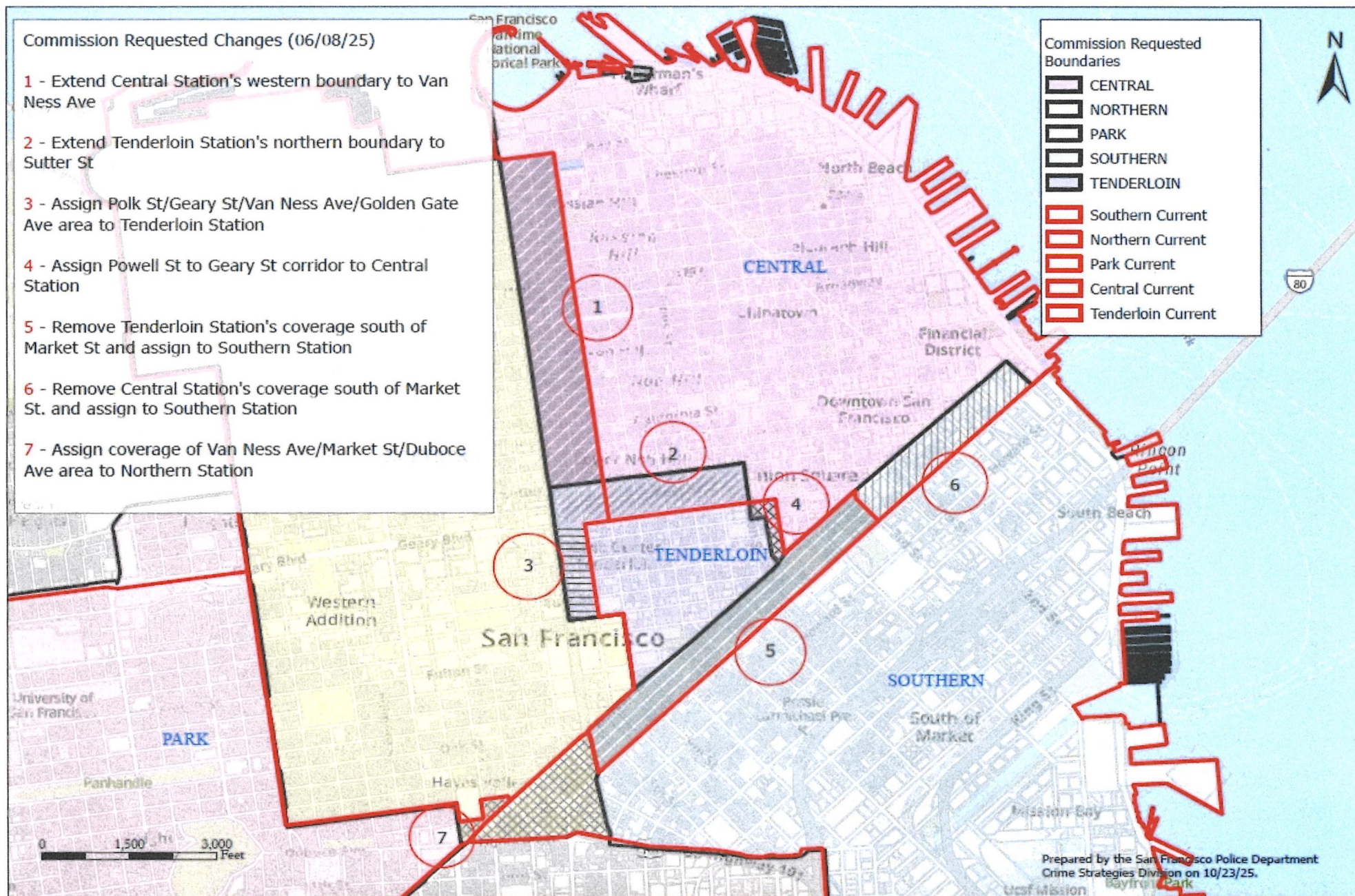

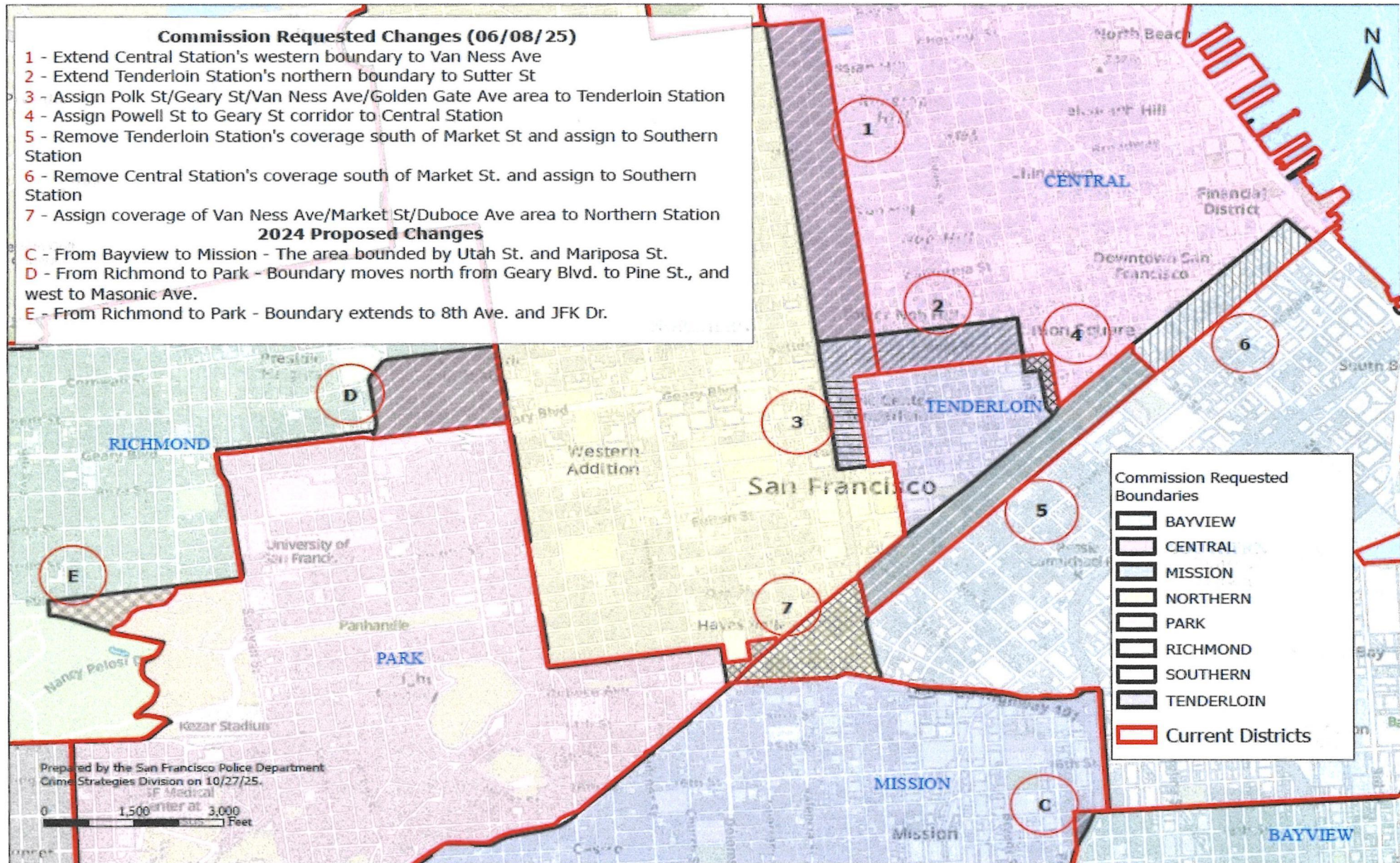
