SDDT-Funded Strategies → **Shorter-Term Outcomes**


- 1) Build community capacity and develop leadership
- 2) Provide health promoting education, programs, and services
- 3) Provide job readiness, skills training, and career pathways
- 4) Expand access to healthy food, water, and oral health
- 5) Decrease access and availability to sugary beverages
- 6) Increase opportunities for physical activity
- 7) Increase economic opportunities in priority neighborhoods
- 8) Increase healthy messaging related to nutrition

Community + Economic Outcomes

- **Food security**
- **Economic opportunity and stability**

Behavioral Outcomes

- **↓** Sugary drink consumption
- **Tap water consumption**
- ↑ Vegetable/fruit consumption
- Physical activity
- **1** Breastfeeding
- Preventative oral health care

Evaluation Foci for 2021/2022

Continue to evaluate:

- ✓ What and how many strategies are being implemented?
- How many people were reached?
- ✓ How are priority populations being engaged?
- ✓ What outcomes are being achieved?

Evaluation Foci for 2021/2022

NEW! Evaluate the impact of SDDT multi-year funding

Specifically, we will explore if and how multi-year funding impacted:

- Organizational stability: Consistent funding to support programs (especially during the pandemic)
- Organizational effectiveness: Funding that supports the organization to carry out the programs effectively (in alignment with the mission and vision)
- Community capacity building: Organization's ability to increase community capacity (e.g., leadership, job skills, economic opportunity) of key populations

Key Interview Questions

- 1. Context How is SDDT funding supporting BIPOC led and BIPOC serving organizations?
 - a. BIPOC-Led: management and/or Board of Directors are predominantly BIPOC
 - **b. BIPOC-Serving**: Majority of clients, program participants, or people who benefit from work are BIPOC
- 2. What did SDDT funds allow you to do that you wouldn't have been able to do otherwise?
- 3. How has SDDT funding contributed to organizational stability?
- 4. How has SDDT funding contributed to organizational effectiveness?
- 5. How, if at all, has SDDT funding contributed to community capacity building?

Evaluation Foci for 2021/2022: Standardization

NEW! Data requested from <u>all</u> funded entities:

- About SDDT-funded activities + services:
 - Number of unduplicated participants, languages in which programs + services were offered, San Francisco neighborhoods where activities took place
- About people who participated in SDDT-funded activities + services: San Francisco neighborhoods where participants live, participant demographic profile
- About people paid wages or stipends with SDDT funds:
 - San Francisco neighborhoods where people paid live, demographic profile of people paid, languages spoken of people paid

Evaluation Reporting for 2021/2022

NEW! Interactive web maps + data dashboard to increase community access to and use of evaluation findings (supporting transparency)

Web maps

- Addresses (points) of programs funded by SDDT with info about program, funding amount per FY, each program's SDDT strategies and outcomes
- Population data on SDDT outcomes (e.g., by census tract)


Data dashboard


- Numbers, demographics of participants
 + staff paid with SDDT funds
- Number of programs + corresponding SDDT revenue supporting implementation of specific SDDT strategies and focused on specific SDDT outcomes

Example Data Dashboard Content: Participant Profile

Demographics of FY 2020-2021 SDDT-Funded Program Participants

Data reported by 18 grantees (from all 4 SDDT-funded grant programs) and 2 City agency programs





2022-2023 SDDT Evaluation Plan

Evaluation Focus for 2022/2023

- ✓ Continue to evaluate:
 - What and how many strategies are being implemented?
 - o How many people were reached?
 - How are priority populations being engaged?
 - What outcomes are being achieved?
- ✓ And update the interactive maps + dashboards to support transparency around how SDDT funding has been used/ increase community access to evaluation findings

NEW! Evaluation Data in FY 2022/2023

Survey portfolio:

- All: Data on increased awareness of health harms of SSB consumption
- Most: Recruit participants to participate in survey with relevant outcomes
- Some: Facilitate alternate method to gather data on relevant outcomes

Annual reporting:

- Unduplicated number of participants per fiscal year
- Support enrolling in CalFresh and/or WIC; referrals to enrollment support

Evaluation Focus for 2022/2023

NEW! Evaluation Portfolio approach/tools:

R+A will develop brief online + paper survey for program participants that explores specific outcomes according to what the funded entity is working on.

Portfolios group funded entities that focus on achieving the same outcomes:

- Decreasing SSB consumption and/or increasing tap water consumption (and/or awareness of beverage industry exploitation/targeted marketing)
- 2) Increasing physical activity
- 3) Increasing fruit and vegetable consumption and increasing food security
