

History of HIV Interventions in SF



Injectables are **safe for HIV prevention and treatment.**



Injectables are an **ongoing PrEP or treatment regimen.** They are not a vaccine or a cure.



Get shots as few as **6 times a year** for HIV treatment, and **2 times a year** for PrEP

HIV Injectables Work Group focus


- 1. Ensure access to** Injectables for HIV treatment and prevention (Injectables) at SFDPH clinical sites

- 3. Generate some of the influx** by promoting injectables in the community, clinics, and support environments funded by HHS and CHEP




