- 1. Edit the Impact document Civil Rights section
- 2. Update the Policy Document to include reference to the Civil Code section 1798.90.5 compliance



Changes Recommended By COIT

Impact Document:

Page 3&4: Edited wording in the 'Civil Rights Impact and Safeguard' section

Policy Document:

- Page 1: Added Statement that Department's Policy Complies with the Civil Code section 1798.90.5
 - > Department ALPR policy is online and will be updated based on adoption of this policy



Business Rule Changes

Department has modified its 72-hours enforcement policy:

- ➢72-hours enforcement is granted 5-days
 - \succ Option for extension of additional 5-days
- ALPR Policy (page 7): In order to enforce the modified policy, 'Data Retention' table on page 7 is updated to 14-days
