Department Mission

The San Francisco Recreation and Park Department's Mission is to provide enriching recreational activities, maintain beautiful parks and preserve the environment for the well-being of our diverse community.

Authorized Use Cases

- 1. Recording video and audio footage in the event of an incident. Incidents can be:
 - 1. Actual or potential criminal conduct
 - 2. Situation when a Park Ranger reasonably believes recordings of evidentiary value may be obtained
 - 3. Calls for service involving a crime where the recording may aid in the apprehension/ prosecution of a suspect
- 2. Providing recording to law enforcement or other authorized persons upon request.

Technology Description

- A BWC is a device worn by a law enforcement officer that makes an electronic audio and video recording of activities that take place during any law enforcement action.
- RecPark has 50 Axon Body 2 and 3 BWC.
 - Axon camera
 - Evidence.com (part of Axon)
- Facial images, voice, audio, location and vehicle license plate can be captured




Technology Description (contd)

- Park Rangers must wear the body worn camera affixed to their uniform in a manner most conducive to recording both audio and video at all times.
- Body worn cameras are typically worn on the front of the uniform's outermost garment facing forward.
- Park Rangers are deployed on Park property.


Alternatives to Technology

Other Details

- Vendor info: Axon
- Storage: Evidence.com (part of Axon)
- Governance: The Chief Park Ranger or designee (Lieutenant Park Ranger 8210 Lead) will be responsible for enforcing the Surveillance Technology policy for BWC.
- Access: Only the Chief Park Ranger or designee (Lieutenant Park Ranger 8210 Lead) will have access to the data.

Other Details – Retention Period

- Body worn camera recordings will be stored for a minimum of one (1) year. Evidence.com auto-deletes after 1 year.
- If data is associated with an incident, it may be kept for longer than the standard retention period.
