MTA Bicycle Program Report: Lydon George, Transportation Planner	 If you have questions or requests, please e-mail: <u>Lydon.george@sfmta.com</u> and <u>jean.long@sfmta.com</u> Discussion about Sloat and Skyline being dangerous for families who will be heading to Sunset Dunes. Bert and Lydon will work offline on this.

- D8: Find it frustrating that every road user is taking into consideration, and not prioritizing car use. Shift emphasis to get infrastructure to be safe, when it's safer for everyone, that's when people will choose alternative modes of transportation.
- Response: people do use their cars in this city, so we have to take that into consideration. That said, we are always looking for ways to get people using other modes
- Sutter quick build was canceled. Update on the website due to land use, loading zones, etc.
- Waymo on Market: building the business core is taking priorities with this administration. They are proven to being a nuisance to transit, and it's a directive of the mayor's office. Uber and other apps are upset and trying to challenge that legally.
- Valencia is a work on progress. 17th street left hand turns, board did elected

SFPD Report: Capt. Pete Shields, SFPD Traffic division

- No updates this month
- D4: no enforcement around some dangerous activity.
- We have a traffic enforcement plan is moving through and we update it every 6 month. For example, if you have an intersection that you have a concern about, tell your police station Captain, then they send that info to us at the Traffic Division. Traffic crashes, escorts, and investigation. At one point we had 80 in our department.
- We are about 200 people understaffed, and also very low in our Traffic department. We have to prioritize our efforts until we get our staff numbers back up.
- D8: do you have early data on speed cameras?
 - No. We don't have the data for that. That's SFMTA.
 - MTA: we know data is getting collected, but not sure how that will be shared publicly
- Captain Dave O'Connor and Captain Pete Shields are both available to come here to present.

SF Dept of Public Works: Clinton Otwell

- Few updates.
- This week is national public works week. We are celebrating 125 years of SF DPW!
- The bike lane sweeper is going to do a demonstration to look at the pull type. Also in the process of purchasing 2 of the bike lane specific, should be in rotation at the end of 2026. The smaller ones just don't hold up very well.
 - D5: Q: is there a chance that purchasing the new sweepers not go through?
 - Yes, that is always a possibilty

May is bike month!

• Bike to Wherever Day is Thursday May 15th

• Campaign updates

- Market Street conversations have picked up again, years after we won car-free Market St. Mayor Lurie announced on April 10 that he would allow Waymos on Market St. We've teamed up with Walk SF, SF Transit Rides, Kid Safe SF, the SF Taxi Workers Alliance and others to push back against the Mayor's decision. If you would like to join the campaign, head to our website.
- Mayor Lurie also pushed the SFMTA to allow left-turns again at 3 intersections on <u>Valencia</u> St after the mid-Valencia Quick-Build got rid of them. We're concerned that this will make congestion worse and make Valencia less safe, since left turns account for 40% of pedestrian fatalities citywide. The SFMTA Board approved the left turns recently and we'll continue pushing to undo this decision.
- The <u>Oak Street</u> Quick-Build was approved on April 1st by the SFMTA Board of Directors. Some construction for the

	project will begin in the coming months, however, since Public Works is repaving Oak Street soon, the majority of the construction will wait until after repaving ends. That means we should have the bike lane built by early spring 2026. We had a great time at the <u>Sunset Dunes</u> grand opening on April 12th! Our bike valet was overflowing with people eager to park their bikes with us. SFBike looks forward to continuing to work on the long-term vision for the Sunset Dunes and how bikes can be part of a thriving and safe park experience.  - D7: i've heard that sharrows are now discouraged by caltrans.
 - MTA: we are looking to slow down the street (not a slow street), the biking and rolling plan is looking to lean to slower traffic and/or protected bike lane
 - Public comment: can we redesignate a left hand turn to be never instead of confusing people when it's no longer rush hour. It's confusing, and leads to bad driving behaviors.
