

### **Staff Working Groups**


- 16 active Staff Working Groups identified
- Public meeting bodies that are established in code
  - All established in code, none in Charter
- Predominantly comprised of City employees (> 50% of seats)
  - 7 comprised solely of City employees
  - 9 include some members who are not City employees

#### **Considerations for Discussion**

- Should these continue to exist in code?
  - Ensures coordination
  - Meetings and materials open to the public

- Should staff coordination be codified?
- Are public meeting bodies best way to coordinate?
- If staff working groups exist in code, should they have sunset provisions?
  - Opportunity to periodically re-evaluate

Often focused on ongoing/ long-range issues (e.g., disaster preparedness)



### **Legally Required Bodies**

- Most bodies have legal duties under Charter or local codes
- 27 bodies identified with state or federal mandates ("legally required")

	Number	Scenario	Impact
	16	Body is required by state or federal law	May not eliminate body; may be possible to explore consolidation
	11	Body fulfills a function required by state or federal law	Must find a suitable alternative to carry out legally required function in order to eliminate

2 bodies have membership/ appointment details prescribed by state law
