

Founding of Trans History Month



On August 24, 2021, San Francisco Mayor London Breed declared August as Transgender History Month in San Francisco. The declaration was the first of its kind in the world, and underscored the City's role as a leader in LGBTQI+ rights and representation.

55 years after the Compton's Cafeteria Riots, the declaration marked a historic collaboration in San Francisco, as elected officials joined the Transgender District and the Office of Transgender Initiatives in recognizing the contributions of transgender people.

With the support of the City and County of San Francisco's Office of Transgender Initiatives (OTI) and the Women's Foundation of California, Ms. Jupiter Peraza and The Transgender District worked with the Mayor to establish the commemorative month.

Compton's Cafeteria Riot

In August of 1966, transgender people and drag queens fought back against police harassment and brutality. At a time when LGBT people were often arrested for socializing, and transgender people and drag queens could be arrested at any time, Gene Compton's Cafeteria was a popular meeting spot for transgender people and drag queens.

Though the event was three years before the Stonewall Riots, the event was largely forgotten until Dr. Susan Stryker's 2005 film, *Screaming Queens: The Riot at Compton's Cafeteria*, brought renewed attention to this pivotal moment of resistance.

In 2022, the City of Santa Clara declared August as Transgender History Month.

2023, support Assemblymember Matt Haney, California officially expanded Transgender History Month statewide, making it the first state in the nation to recognize the month of August as Transgender History Month.

In 2024, the San Diego City Council unanimously declared August Transgender History Month.

In 2025, Windsor became the first Sonoma community County recognize Transgender History Month.

have been introduced in state legislature across the country so far

While the rights of LGBTQI+ people have advanced greatly since 1966, many of the wins of yesterday are currently under attack. It was only in 1974 that San Francisco's anti cross-dressing law was repealed.

Today, even foundational rights are at risk. In recent years, state legislatures across the country have attempted to implement drag bans. US v Skrmetti rolled back the rights for trans youth and their families to access lifesaving care. This week, the Supreme Court was asked to review Obergefell v Hodges, the case that enshrined the right to same-sex marriage in the United States.
