
GUN VIOLENCE – CITYWIDE

GUN VIOLENCE: Total gun violence is DOWN 5% compared to 2025

- There was 1 non-fatal shooting incident causing injuries to 1 victim the week ending 03.01.26
 - For the year, there are a total of 17 fatal/non-fatal incidents resulting in 20 victims

TOTAL HOMICIDES: Homicides are UP 700% compared to 2025

- **There was 1 homicide incident reported the week ending 03.01.26**
 - There are 8 homicides YTD with 5 resulting from a firearm.
 - There are no homicides in March 2026
 - **Overall Clearance Rate for 2026: 129%**





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
Gun Violence YTD Comparison 2025 vs. 2026





Shootings YTD - By Month - 2025 vs. 2026
