Dear Commissioners and Mayor Lurie,

I'm writing as a homeowner in the Shipyards in Hunters Point. Many of us bought here because we believed in the vision of a new, safe, and thriving neighborhood. While the city has reported lower crime overall, what we're experiencing in our community tells a very different story.

In addition to last night's break-in at 555 Innes (where the individuals cut through several locks and were in and out in minutes), there are regular reports of storage break-ins, attempted entries, and gunshots in the immediate area. This isn't an isolated incident. It's an ongoing pattern that has residents on edge.

We also have images from Sunday at 10 Innes that appear to show the same group involved in the most recent theft. It looks like they are moving intentionally through multiple buildings and targeting the Shipyard community.

People here feel increasingly unsafe, and the situation is clearly escalating. We are asking for immediate attention and meaningful action: increased patrols, follow-up on these incidents, and support in identifying and stopping the individuals responsible.

Thank you for taking this matter seriously. We want to feel safe in the neighborhood we invested in and believed in.
