Purpose & Overview

- Compare Guaranteed Income (GI) and VA benefit programs.
- Identify overlaps in financial stability, health, and caregiving.
- Highlight lessons for policy and outreach.
- Support data-informed discussions for Veteran well-being.

Guaranteed Income (GI) Overview

- Provides unconditional monthly cash payments (\$500–\$1,000 typical).
- Implemented in Stockton, Chicago, Los Angeles, and Atlanta.
- 2024 research covered 10,000+ families across 9 randomized trials.
- Focus: promote financial security and flexibility.

Guaranteed Income Outcomes

- Increased financial resilience and mental well-being.
- Caregivers gained extra three-hours per week for family time.
- More youth re-enrolled in education or training.
- Minimal job loss, more purposeful employment choices.

Multigenerational Impact

- Improved school outcomes and college aspirations.
- Better housing stability and safer neighborhoods.
- Lower stress and domestic conflict.
- Long-term ROI across generations.

VA Pension & Aid & Attendance (A&A) Overview

- Needs-based income for low-income wartime Veterans.
- Established in 1858 to assist Veterans and survivors.
- A&A adds support for Veterans needing daily care.
- Supplements income for aging or disabled Veterans.

Eligibility Simplified

- Age 65+, or permanent disability.
- Wartime service: 90 days active duty with 1 day during wartime.
- Income and net worth below limits set by Congress.
- Includes spouse and dependent considerations.

Impact & Utilization

- \$3.3B paid to 276,000+ Veterans in 2017.
- 41% received A&A enhanced benefits.
- Higher healthcare use and social work engagement.
- Lower psychiatric admissions and serious mental illness rates.

VA Disability Compensation Overview

- Tax-free monthly payment for service-connected disabilities.
- Covers both physical and mental health conditions.
- 3.9M Veterans received \$120B in 2022.
- Median monthly payment: \$724; average annual: \$15K.

VA Disability Impacts

- Reduces food insecurity by 4.1% and homelessness by 1.3%.
- No increase in alcohol or substance use.
- Improved communication and trust with VA clinicians.
- Enhances preventive care engagement and satisfaction.

Key Differences Summary

- GI: Broad eligibility, unconditional cash, supports flexibility.
- VA Pension: Means-tested, income-sensitive, supports aging Veterans.
- A&A: Pension supplement for daily care assistance.
- Disability Compensation: Non-means-tested, service-linked support.
