CHAMBER OF COMMERCE CITYBEAT POLL

The CityBeat 2026 poll shows broad-based improvement across nearly every major indicator of civic confidence:

- 64% of voters say San Francisco is headed in the right direction, up sharply from just 26% in 2021
- 44% say overall quality of life has improved, reaching a five-year high
- 92% say a thriving downtown is critical to the regional economy
- 75% say the city is making progress on the downtown economy with new events, conventions, and businesses, a 27-point increase from last year
- Perceptions of safety downtown are at their highest levels in years, particularly among frequent visitors






