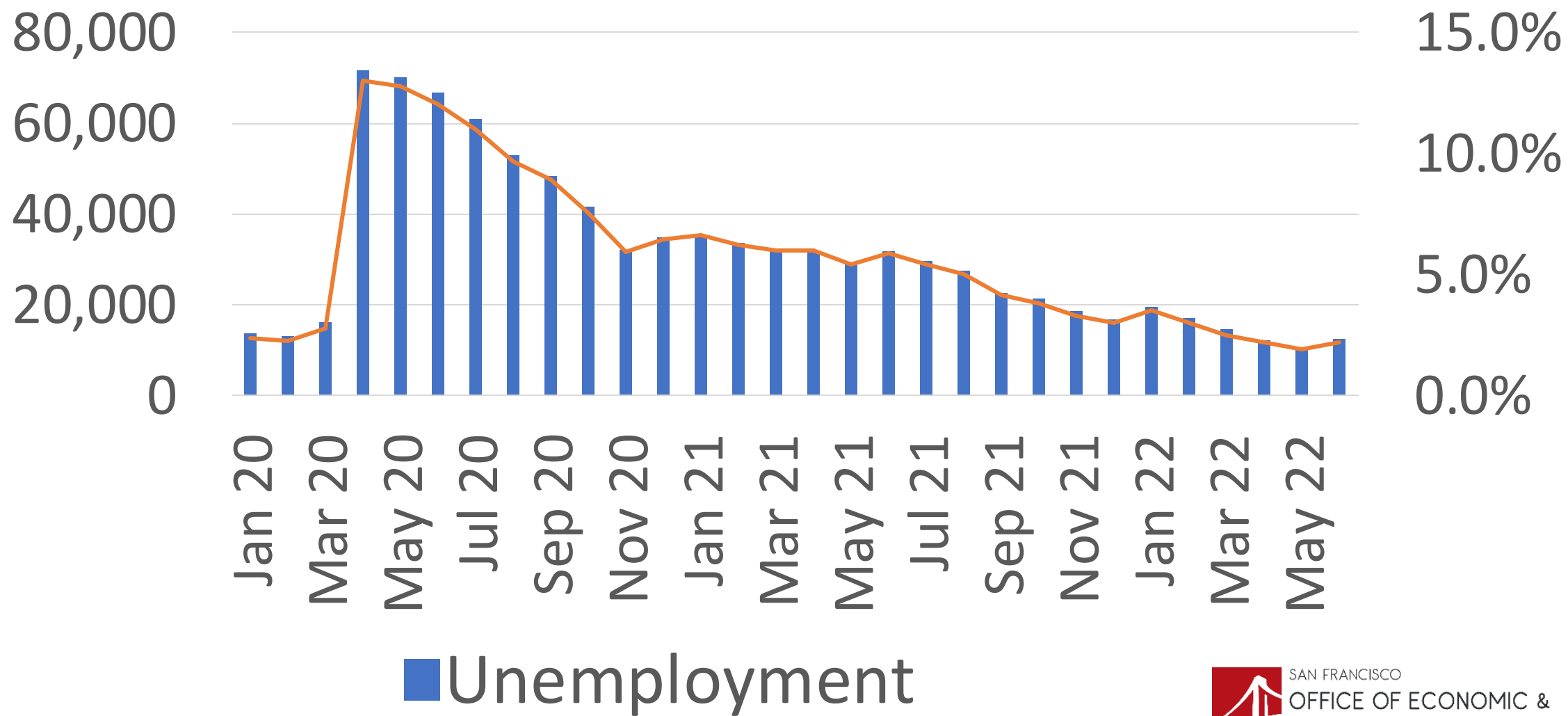

- **San Francisco, CA is doubling their CityBuild construction pre-apprenticeship program**, administered through a partnership between the San Francisco Office of Economic and Workforce Development, City College of San Francisco, North America's Building Trades Unions (NABTU), local building trade apprenticeship programs, community non-profit organizations, and industry employers. In 2021, Mayor Breed announced the expansion of CityBuild, an effort to coordinate citywide construction training and employment programs, to train and provide construction jobs to 600 additional San Franciscans over the next two years, doubling the program's capacity. The city's investment will expand workforce development, paid training, and job placement for adults and youth in San Francisco, and will include targeted resources to address the disproportionate Black unemployment rate and provide opportunities for disadvantaged residents on infrastructure projects covered by the city's local hiring policy.
