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Summary for February 18, 2026

The Department of Police Accountability's highlights for the week:

- **Budget:** The departmental phase of the FY2026-27 budget process concludes this week, and DPA will submit its budget to the Mayor's Budget Office on Friday.
- **COIT Hearing:** Nicole Armstrong and Eric Ho presented before the COIT Budget & Performance Subcommittee on DPA's digitization project, which converts all departmental records from the 1980s through 2018 into digital format. The presentation was well received and will be featured as a success story by the Subcommittee.

Investigation Updates:

◆ **Statistics Since the Last Police Commission Meeting (February 11, 2026):**

- **Cases Opened:** 17
- **Cases Closed:** 8
- Year-to-Date Comparison:
 - Volume of incoming complaints this year is slightly lower than for the same period last year.
 - DPA is completing investigations at a similar rate to the same period last year.
