the highest in the state and the nation and produced unhelpful effects, including discouraging investment in housing development and suppressing office-building sales, both of which can provide employment for contractors, the latter through tenant improvements. Others contest those assessments.

The tax has also stifled investments in improvements to hotels and apartment buildings, among other areas, said Anne Taupier, executive director of The City's Office of Economic and Workforce Development, in the mayor's press release.

"Prop. I was very well-intentioned, and we are working on addressing the same problems it was set to address," Mahmood said. "We're just saying it should be restructured in a way that it doesn't have a negative impact on housing construction or the jobs that our construction workers are reliant on."

Mahmood estimated that the BUILD Act would lower the cost of housing construction by about \$32,000 per unit.

Lurie and Mahmood's proposal is supported by various labor and business groups, including the San Francisco Building and Construction Trades Council, the North Coast States Carpenters Union, Laborers Union Local 261 and the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce. Its co-sponsors include Supervisors Matt Dorsey and Danny Sauter.

"To offset general fund revenue impacts over time, the legislative package includes a drafting request for a November 2026 ballot measure," said the mayor's press release. "The measure would ensure transfer tax is paid on more transactions, including potentially eliminating a tax exemption for certain parties who are foreclosing on a property or accepting a deed in lieu of foreclosing."

Assessor-Recorder Joaquín Torres said

in the mayor's release that there had been a "dramatic increase" in the number of high-value commercial transfers claiming exemptions in recent years, so a change would have "big implications" for The City.

In addition, Lurie has convened city officials to identify within three months a "more effective" source of funding for affordable housing, though what form that might take is not yet clear, the announcement said. The group is considering options that include a bond measure, raising the limit on the city's Housing Trust Fund, tax-increment financing and the use of certificates of participation.

"Our goal is to make sure that we have a dedicated, reliable source of affordable-housing funding, and we are looking into different mechanisms to do that," Mahmood said. "We are committing to figuring out an affordable housing financing plan."

Such promises have not mollified opponents who say a transfer-tax cut would flout the will of the voters by giving a windfall to wealthy interests and facilitating market-rate development while leaving affordable housing underfunded.

Critics have included Quintin Mecke, executive director of the Council of Community Housing Organizations, who said via email that cutting transfer taxes "makes no sense" given the need for affordable housing for which state housing law requires The City to plan.

Mecke said his organization's 18 member organizations had not been consulted in developing the tax cut proposal, which

he called a "significant gap."

Preston, Prop. I's sponsor, called the idea that a transfer-tax cut would spur the creation of housing "a joke."

The proposed rollback of Prop. I, which was approved by more than 57% of city voters, "threatens hundreds of millions of dollars intended for affordable housing, and gives billionaires like [President] Donald Trump millions of dollars in tax breaks when they sell their building," Preston said via text message. Trump owns a share of the office tower at 555 California St.

Aditya Bhumbra, co-chair of the San Francisco chapter of the Democratic Socialists of America, questioned whether the tax money that would be lost from large commercial properties would be replaced. "They're saying it's going to be revenue-neutral, and I just don't see how that's gonna be the case," he said. "I'd rather we just use that money and have the government spend to acquire buildings and build new social housing."

Bhumbra's group has argued that many of the properties that would receive tax cuts are older apartment buildings. He said he was skeptical the tax cut would lead to more housing construction.

Bhumbra also pointed out that there was no rush of office-to-housing conversions after the passage of Proposition C, former Mayor London Breed's 2024 ballot measure, which waived the transfer tax the first time a property is transferred for a maximum of five million square feet of conversions of non-residential to residential space.

Prop. C, which was aimed at boosting the downtown economy, also paved the way for reversing Prop. I, which was placed on the 2020 ballot by Preston and four other supervisors.

The 2020 ballot argument in favor of Prop. I said the tax increase would help prevent "a wave of evictions that will increase homelessness due to renters being unable to make rent payments because of the pandemic."

That argument also referenced a unanimous Board of Supervisors resolution stating that a top priority for new revenue would be "emergency rent relief and permanently affordable housing."

The measure did not specify how the tax proceeds would be spent, however, and as a result they went into the general fund.

Advocates say that Prop. I revenue has never been fully dedicated to social housing as voters intended, but it nevertheless provided more than \$200 million for housing-related programs as of 2024, including \$42 million for rent relief during the COVID-19 pandemic, \$40 million for banking land used to build more than 550 affordable homes, and \$64 million for housing acquisition.

The City Controller estimated in 2020 that the tax increase would on average generate additional revenue of \$196 million per year, but also said that the tax "is the City's most volatile revenue source and estimates based on prior years' activity may not be predictive of future revenues."

Since going into effect in January of 2021, the tax had generated \$504.6 million through February, taking in a low of \$44.9 million in fiscal year 2023-24 and a high of \$178.1 million in fiscal year 2021-22, the City Controller's office said.

Mahmood said there is a need for a more predictable, dedicated mechanism for funding affordable housing.

"So we're looking to fulfill that part of the promise as well," Mahmood said.
