

[Planning Code - Landmark Designation - Mission Congregational Church]

**Ordinance amending the Planning Code to designate the Mission Congregational Church, located at 3689 19th Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 3598, Lot No. 060, on the south side of 19th Street between Dolores Street and Guerrero Street, as a landmark consistent with the standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; and making public necessity, convenience, and welfare findings under Planning Code, Section 302, and findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.**

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Findings.

(a) Environmental and Land Use Findings.

(1) The Planning Department has determined that the Planning Code amendment proposed in this ordinance is subject to a Categorical Exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq., hereinafter "CEQA") pursuant to Section 15308 of California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Sections 15000 et seq., the Guidelines for implementation of the statute, for actions by regulatory agencies for protection of the environment (in this case, landmark designation).

1 Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 260583 and  
2 is incorporated herein by reference. The Board of Supervisors affirms this determination.

3 (2) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, the Board of Supervisors finds that  
4 the proposed landmark designation of the Mission Congregational Church will serve the public  
5 necessity, convenience, and welfare for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation  
6 Commission Resolution No. 1575, recommending approval of the proposed designation,  
7 which is incorporated herein by reference.

8 (3) The Board of Supervisors finds that the proposed landmark designation of  
9 the Mission Congregational Church is consistent with the General Plan and with Planning  
10 Code Section 101.1(b) for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation Commission  
11 Resolution No. 1575, which is incorporated herein by reference.

12 (b) General Findings.

13 (1) On March 3, 2026, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution  
14 No. 102-26, initiating landmark designation of the Mission Congregational Church as a San  
15 Francisco Landmark pursuant to Section 1004.1 of the Planning Code. On Marh 6, 2026, the  
16 Mayor approved the resolution. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of  
17 Supervisors in File No. 260055.

18 (2) Pursuant to Charter Section 4.135, the Historic Preservation Commission  
19 has authority "to recommend approval, disapproval, or modification of landmark designations  
20 and historic district designations under the Planning Code to the Board of Supervisors."

21 (3) The Landmark Designation Fact Sheet dated May 20, 2026 was prepared  
22 by Planning Department Preservation staff. All preparers meet the Secretary of the Interior's  
23 Professional Qualification Standards for historic preservation program staff, as set forth in  
24 Code of Federal Regulations Title 36, Part 61, Appendix A. The report was reviewed for  
25 accuracy and conformance with the purposes and standards of Article 10 of the Planning

1 Code. A copy of the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet is on file with the Clerk of the Board of  
2 Supervisors in File No. 260583 and is incorporated herein by reference.

3 (4) The Historic Preservation Commission, at its regular meeting of  
4 May 20, 2026, reviewed Planning Department staff's analysis of the historical significance of  
5 the Mission Congregational Church set forth in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

6 (5) On May 20, 2026, after holding a public hearing on the proposed  
7 designation and having considered the specialized analyses prepared by Planning  
8 Department staff and the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet, the Historic Preservation  
9 Commission recommended designation of the Mission Congregational Church as a landmark  
10 consistent with the standards set forth in Section 1004 of the Planning Code, by Resolution  
11 No. 1575. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File  
12 No. 260583.

13 (6) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the Mission Congregational  
14 Church has a special character and special historical, cultural, architectural, and aesthetic  
15 interest and value, and that its designation as a landmark will further the purposes of and  
16 conform to the standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code. In doing so, the Board of  
17 Supervisors hereby incorporates by reference the findings of the Landmark Designation Fact  
18 Sheet.

19  
20 Section 2. Designation.

21 Pursuant to Section 1004.3 of the Planning Code, the Mission Congregational Church,  
22 located at 3689 19th Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 3598, Lot No. 060, is hereby  
23 designated as a San Francisco landmark consistent with the standards set forth in  
24 Section 1004. Appendix A to Article 10 of the Planning Code is hereby amended to include  
25 this property.

1  
2 Section 3. Required Data.

3 (a) The description, location, and boundary of the landmark site consists of the  
4 footprint of the Mission Congregational Church, located on Assessor's Parcel Block No. 3598  
5 Lot No. 060, on the south side of 19th Street between Dolores Street and Guerrero Street in  
6 San Francisco's Mission neighborhood, as shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

7 (b) The characteristics of the landmark that justify its designation are described and  
8 shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet and other supporting materials contained in  
9 Planning Department Record Docket No. 2026-001917DES. In brief, the Mission  
10 Congregational Church, located at 3689 19th Street is eligible for local designation as an  
11 intact example of a Gothic Revival Church in San Francisco, and for its association with  
12 post-1906 earthquake and fire reconstruction of the Mission Neighborhood. Constructed  
13 in 1910, the brick-framed church was designed by architect Reverend Francis W. Reid. The  
14 church was built as the Mission Congregational Church, which was a consolidation of the  
15 Third Congregational Church organized in 1863 and the Olivet Congregational Church  
16 organized in 1884. In 1930, the church was purchased by the Ascension Lutheran Church.  
17 While the parcel was vacant prior to the Great 1906 Earthquake and Fires, it lies in an area  
18 heavily impacted by the Fires, known as the burn zone. Thus, the church is associated with  
19 the neighborhood's reconstruction following the disaster.

20 (c) The particular features that should be preserved, or replaced in kind as determined  
21 necessary, are those generally shown in photographs and described in the Landmark  
22 Designation Fact Sheet, which can be found in Planning Department Record Docket  
23 No. 2026-001917DES, and which are incorporated in this designation by reference as though  
24 fully set forth herein. This designation does not identify any interior character-defining  
25 features. Specifically, the features that are character-defining and shall be preserved or

1 replaced in kind are the exterior elevations, form, massing, structure, rooflines, architectural  
2 ornament, and materials of the property, identified as:

- 3 (1) Corner location of the building on the property;  
4 (2) Two-story height;  
5 (3) Varied roof form, including intersecting hipped roof and flat roof;  
6 (4) North and west street facing gables;  
7 (5) Metal frame with brick walls, red pressed brick facing, and red sandstone  
8 trimmings, and exterior brick buttresses;  
9 (6) Lancet, arched, and rectangular openings with deeply recessed windows,  
10 including a trio of stained-glass windows with floral designs;  
11 (7) Tall, square, crenulated tower; and  
12 (8) Two sets of wood paneled double doors on west facing façade.

13  
14 Section 4. Effective Date.

15 This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after enactment. Enactment  
16 occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or  
17 does not sign the ordinance within 10 days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors  
18 overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

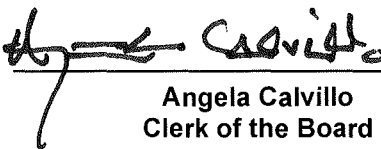

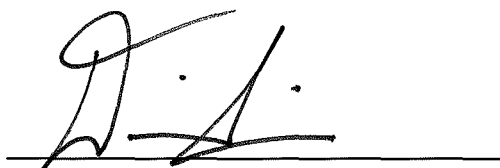
